Volunteers Building Hundreds of Homes: Habitat for Humanity in Northern Virginia

Habitat for Humanity is a can-do success story around the world. Volunteers working under trained supervision have built 350,000 homes in 3,000 communities, providing shelter for 1.75 million otherwise homeless people. This is the non-profit organization where former President Jimmy Carter and wife Rosalynn grab hammer, power saw, and drywall to work side-by-side with the team. Participants of all ages and backgrounds find that the Habitat is as much a life-changing experience for them as for the people they help. Karen Cleveland, CEO and President of the Northern Virginia Habitat for Humanity will discuss several innovative projects in our community and several ways that volunteers can gain "hands-on" experience. Beyond building affordable shelter, what can Habitat teach us about organizing and leadership skills when young and old alike work together? Learn about past successes, present challenges, and future plans to aid the homeless in our neighborhoods.

March's book for review is "The Guernsey Literary and Potato Peel Pie Society." by Mary Ann Shaffer and Annie Barrows. Although the words in the title are hard to remember in the right sequence, you will long remember the characters in the book once you read it. The story starts shortly after World War II as a London writer is looking for her next book subject. Because of a letter from a native of Guernsey, the British island off the coast of England, she finds herself drawn to this man and his friends who belong to the Guernsey Literary and Potato Peel Pie Society, their island book club. She begins a remarkable correspondence with the Society's charming, deeply human members, from pig farmers to phrenologists. Through their letters she learns about their island and the powerful, transformative impact the recent German occupation has had on their lives. Eventually she visits Guernsey, and what she finds there will change her forever.

Fairfax Census Office Open

Fairfax County Board of Supervisors Chairwoman Sharon Bulova (D-At large) and other local officials will help kick off the 2010 Census effort on Thursday, at the official opening of the local Census office.

Census day is April 1. Forms will be mailed to all households in the county in March. Those who do not return their forms by mail will get a visit from a Census Bureau worker to obtain the information in person.

The U.S. Constitution requires a count of the population every 10 years to determine the number of representatives each state has in the House of Representatives. Virginia will also conduct redistricting of its General Assembly districts following the census. Data collected during the census is also used to distribute more than \$400 billion in federal money to localities.


