Don Reynolds will give a powerful, poignant eyewitness presentation about events which changed the world.

This month our food donations will be delivered to ACCA (Annandale Christian Community for Action) by Betty Lee Thatcher and Carol Weber. Since 1967, ACCA has been helping low-income families in the Annandale, Baileys Crossroads, and Culmore areas of Fairfax County. A collaboration of 26 churches, ACCA operates a food pantry, a development day care center, furniture, and transportation programs. ACCA also supports other programs including scholarships for students with disabilities, Rebuilding Together (housing rehabilitation), CROP Walk (supporting Church World Service), the Bailey's Shelter, and Meals-on-Wheels. Except for the Child Development Center, all ACCA services are delivered by volunteers.
Like every other food pantry in our area, ACCA's food pantry has experienced an increase in requests for help this year. Any non-perishable food will be appreciated. Canned fruit and spaghetti sauce are in short supply right now. There is always a need for rice and dried beans as well as paper products.

## LLI 2010 Scholarship Winners

The scholarship committee met in early April to interview 13 of the 36 students from NOVA who had applied for leadership and academic scholarships. Through the generosity of LLI members we were able to award \$9,000 in scholarship money, the same as last year. And, just the same as last year, it was hard to select the winners among the many wonderful, bright, caring and hardworking applicants.
GRECIA BALBOA, winner of the $\$ 2,000$ Knox Singleton Leadership Scholarship, is the Virginia Region Honors Chair for Phi Theta Kappa and organized a leadership conference for all honors students of two-year colleges in Virginia. On campus, she also acted as team captain and recruitment chair to raise money for the American Cancer Society through Relay for Life; was the public relations and service officer for the Hispanic Student Union; and, being interested in communications and international relations, created the campus Media Communications Club and started the Model UN. Off campus, she is an ESL volunteer tutor at her church, and provides food to homeless people in DC every weekend with the church youth group. She volunteers at Petsmart every weekend helping the adoption of homeless animals. Her goal is to become a journalist and one day to work with the government of her home country of Bolivia to represent it internationally.

> ANN PIMLEY, winner of a $\$ 1,000$ Leadership Scholarship, deserves special recognition for incredible community involvement for the disabled both on and off campus. She lost her sight eight years ago, and from that time on, has been a strong advocate for the disabled, working with the Fairfax Area Disabilities Services Board, and has been its chair for the past two years. At NOVA she speaks out on many issues relating to the American with Disabilities Act, helping the college become more aware of how to improve so that all students have equal access to the learning process. Her goal is to complete her degree and continue to be a strong leader in the disability community.

EUNJIN (GINNY) HONG, winner of a \$1,000 Leadership Scholarship, is Vice President of Service for Phi Theta Kappa, created leadership opportunities for committee chairs of large scale campus events such as a college-wide Toy Drive Competition for the Children's National Medical Center and the local James Mott Community Assistance Program; educated students on campus
about HIV and STDs as a part of World AIDS Day; collaborated with other campus clubs to organize a park clean-up; visit to a local secondary school to organize leadership activities for the students, and a mentoring program for at-risk students at Annandale High School. She is a student ambassador for the Annandale campus. She also took the initiative to launch a new club, the Korean Students Association, to address their needs and promote cultural awareness. She intends to pursue a career in Public Policy and International Political Economics.
RAHAT HUSSEIN, an engineering student, also a winner of a 1,000 Leadership Scholarship, has taken on several leadership roles at NOVA. He is a student ambassador on the Annandale campus and assisted with the new student orientation program and campus tours. He is president of and passionate about his leadership role in the Visual and Performing Arts Association. He was one of only two students selected to speak to a meeting of CEOs of engineering and architectural firms to create an interest in their establishing scholarships for NOVA students. At the college Tutoring Center, he is rated as one of the top tutors, looked up to by other tutors and asked for by many students seeking help. His long-term goal involves coordinating engineers and artists to solve problems successfully in respect to environmental concerns, as he aims to work in the fields of transportation, effective energy utilization, and alternative fuels.
FAN FENG, winner of the $\$ 2,000$ Academic Scholarship, was described by one of her professors in his letter of recommendation as "an example of the very best we have to offer academically at NOVA." She is clearly outstandingly gifted and is headed to Amherst in the Fall. Her goal is to go to law school to become a public counsel. She is one of only two individuals nominated for the prestigious Jack Kent Cooke scholarship.
