The Dynamic Growth of the Smithsonian Associates: Accomplishments, Opportunities, Future Plans

Barbara Tuceling, Director of the Smithsonian Institution's Associate and Resident Associate Programs, will give an insider's look into one of the nation's foremost educational experiences. For 35 years, Ms. Tuceling has been working with the Smithsonian to pioneer new and innovative courses and membership expansion. What have been some of the biggest management challenges? How is the vast, diverse curriculum put together? What does she view as some of the highlights of her tenure as director and what have been some of the controversies? LLI 2011 Scholarship News

Thank you, generous LLI members, for helping us reach our goal of raising \$9,000 for this year's student scholarships. As of December 31, 2010, we had received 126 checks from members totaling \$9,270. This will allow us to make the planned awards.

The scholarships are currently being advertised widely on the Annandale campus. There are fliers on notice-boards throughout the campus. Students have received emails; faculty members have also received emails and have been encouraged to advise their best and brightest students to apply; and the deans of the various departments have been told about the scholarships in meetings organized by Dr Bruce Mann, Dean of Liberal Arts, who is our active and very helpful campus coordinator. The closing date for receipt of completed applications is March 14, i.e. the first day after Spring Break; hence students have the entire Spring Break to finalize their applications.

Applications include essays in which students discuss their achievements to date, both in academic and leadership capacities. Also, they are asked to explain their short and long-term career goals. Applicants for the academic scholarships are required to demonstrate financial need; leadership scholarships are awarded to students with outstanding leadership and academic skills, but are not need-based. We will interview the top applicants in early April and will keep you informed of our decisions.

The Arlington Food Assistance Center (AFAC) is a community-based nonprofit organization that provides supplemental groceries to Arlington neighbors in need. AFAC currently distributes groceries each week to over 1,200 families. Nearly 40 percent of the people they serve are children. In this especially difficult economy, their current needs include hot and cold low-sugar cereals, pasta (dry packaged), canned meats such as tuna, salmon or chicken, corned beef hash and chili, low-sodium soups, and canned tomato sauces. In addition, AFAC uses hundreds of paper and plastic grocery bags each week, so if you have some extra ones, feel free to donate those as well. Gina Trapp has volunteered to deliver our donations following the February 1 Forum. As you know, food pantries around the area have been hard hit by the increased need for help for people who have lost jobs and are unable to find new ones. In August, there were about 70,000 unemployed in Northern Virginia and last year about 17 million households in the U.S. were without enough food for at least part of the year. LLI's contributions to local food pantries continue to be very much needed and appreciated.
