What was the cultural impact of prohibition on the spread of jazz through thousands of speakeasy clubs? David Thompson has worked closely with Ken Burns in achieving several award-winning, balanced, scholarly, insightful and riveting series on American history.

Welcome back to the Fall session. The board has remained active during the summer and met for an all-day retreat to discuss the long-range efforts of LLI. As we start a new year, we look forward to working with many of you.

A brief note on some of the issues of interest to the members:

<u>Volunteerism</u> — We keep our costs down by depending on volunteer efforts; everything from bringing in food, to working on the committees and participation on the board. We look to you for support and really need a *typistlorganizer* to put our catalogue together.

<u>**Travel</u>** — Ginny Moser, along with Martie Klee, agreed to take on the effort of travel planning, at least temporarily, and we hope you will work with them on travel planning.</u>

<u>Move</u> —We are still in transition in our office move. The school has planned to move us into new offices in the Administration building and perhaps we will be there by the time you read this.

<u>Parking</u> — This is a very difficult situation and depends on many issues. Fortunately, classes will not be in session on September 1 and LLI members may park for free, if there is space, in the garage or anywhere in student lot B. Generally the parking is better toward the end of the week, but the forum room is not often available then. We have arranged for this Forum to be on a Thursday. Other Forums will often be on a Wednesday and, hopefully, this will improve the parking situation. We have arranged for the parking garage to sell one-day parking tickets when the garage is full so you can park in the student lot. Unfortunately, they have not figured out how to do this on an hourly basis so we have to pay the \$6 rate for a full day.

CHO is open to all individuals and religious, civic and service organizations interested in improving quality of life for all in the community. In addition to operating a food closet, CHO provides family emergency assistance, a clothes closet, a furniture warehouse, transportation service and Meals on Wheels.


