How Congress Operates: Senate and House Differences



Our speaker is **Donald A. Ritchie,** Historian of the United States Senate. In the Senate Historical Office, Ritchie conducts oral histories, prepares historical documents for publication, and provides research and reference

materials for senators, senate committees, scholars and the media. In his positions as Deputy Historian and then Historian, Don has assisted many speakers with the various types of congressional records.

Ritchie has excelled in many aspects of the profession of historian. He has authored several books, including, *Press Gallery: Congress and the Washington Correspondents,* Harvard University Press, for which he won the coveted Richard Leopold Prize from the Organization of American Historians; *Our Constitution,* Oxford University Press; and *Doing Oral History: A Practical Guide.* In addition, he has served as president of the Oral History Association and on the councils of the American Historical Association, the Society for History in the Federal Government, and the International Oral History Association.

Although Don bears the regular trademarks of the academic historian, for most of his career he has been employed in the public history field. Between his MA in history from the University of Maryland in 1969, and his Ph.D, awarded in 1975, Don served in the United States Marine Corps.



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Baltimore Day Trip June 15 — Tall Ships and War of 1912



Set aside Friday, June 15, for a day trip to Baltimore as the city celebrates the bicentennial of the War of 1812. Start with a docent led tour of the special War of 1812 exhibit at the Maryland

Historical Society featuring the original manuscript of "The Star Spangled Banner" and other memorabilia from the War with sufficient time to view other exhibits at the society. A tour highlight will be a one-hour afternoon cruise featuring spectacular views from the water and an insider's view of Baltimore's rich history, including the world famous Fort McHenry.

As part of the 1812 celebration, more than 40 ships, including tall ships from around the world, and U.S. Navy, British and Canadian Grey Hulls, are expected to dock in Baltimore's famous Inner Harbor, Fells Point, and Locust Point June 13-19. Lunch, on your own, will be at the Inner Harbor, where you can experience these ships up close.



BALTIMORE CELEBRATES THE 200TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE WAR OF 1812



We will start our day at the Maryland Historical Society with a guided tour of their special exhibit entitled "With Broad Stripes and Bright Stars" in celebration of the 200th Anniversary of the War of 1812. Baltimore played a major role in the war, inspiring what would become our nation's anthem. The original manuscript of the Star-Spangled Banner penned by Francis Scott Key, one of America's great icons, is on display. The British attacked Baltimore by land and sea a few weeks after burning Washington. Museum goers will view portraits of the Baltimore Defenders of 1814, Maryland's own War of 1812 "Rock Stars"...Samuel Smith, George Armistead, John Stricker, and Isaac McKim, who defeated the British. Their portraits were commissioned by the city and completed by Rembrandt Peale. There will be time to visit other displays at the museum which include furniture, silver, textiles, porcelain, pottery, paintings, glass, etc.

Lunch will be on your own at the Inner Harbor.

More than 40 international ships, tall ships from around the world and US Navy, British and Canadian Grey Hulls will be docked at the Inner Harbor, Fells Point, Locust Point and Canton. As time permits, you can stroll along the inner harbor viewing the ships. We will then board a Spirit Cruise ship for a one-hour tour of the harbor featuring narration and spectacular views from the water of the ships and an insider's view of Baltimore's rich history, including the world famous Fort McHenry.




