The Mud March: Might This Have Been the Decisive Turning Point in the Civil War?

Whenever Ranger Michael T. Kelly speaks to LLI members, history comes to life. His illustrated talks capture the events, personalities, strategies, significance, and turmoil of our past. Thus, he will relive for us a part of the Civil War that began in December 1862. The Army of

the Potomac, under Maj. General Ambrose Burnside, had recently been defeated at the Battle of Fredericksburg and the Northern army was in disarray with low morale. General Burnside then began an ambitious winter campaign to outflank General Lee, circling to the west below Richmond but the Northern troops got caught in torrential rain and mud. Meanwhile, two generals on Burnside's staff leaked disparaging information to Lincoln's cabinet and, as war commander, Abraham Lincoln was faced with major decisions. Six months after the failed Mud March, the two armies clashed at Gettysburg.

### Campus Parking for the Handicapped

He also provides ongoing leadership for his park's involvement in War of 1812 Bicentennial and American Civil War commemorations, as well as the approaching 57th Presidential Inauguration. Additionally, for a number of years, he has led many LLI courses, and we are pleased that he is our featured Forum speaker.

Please join us in January for Ranger Kelly's informative and entertaining presentation that will increase your knowledge of our nation's history and demonstrate why he continues to be popular with LLI members.

Our January food collection goes to the Providence Presbyterian Church, located on Little River Turnpike about a half-mile west of the Community College in a seemingly prosperous neighborhood. However, a number of homes and many apartments in close proximity to the church consist of low income residents who face hardships during these most difficult times. Some are one-parent families and some are poor families that are unable to provide the food required for daily living.

Providence has in the past provided some if not all the food for about 15 families. This has grown recently to approximately 20 families and has created a drain on the food closets that the parishioners maintain. The pantry is presently in need of canned vegetables, fruits, and meats as well as dried beans, rice, flour and sugar. Other needs are cereals, peanut butter and jelly.

Our generous donations can make a difference in the way Providence is able to support these needy families. Clint and Kathy Hall will deliver this month's donations.


