An Inside Look into the Federal Communications Commission: The Challenges of Regulating the Air Waves and Reaching Underserved Communities

The Federal Communications Commission, an independent government agency overseen by Congress, regulates interstate and international communications by radio, television, wire, satellite and cable throughout the entire country and all U.S. territories. Through its policies and enforcement actions, the FCC has a huge impact on our economy, society, and basic freedoms by regulating broadcast

stations; striving to expand competition; innovating and investing all forms of communication; responding to a broad variety of consumer complaints; providing an essential role in emergency preparedness, including the regulation of amateur radio operators and 911 operations; and speaking out vigorously for the underprivileged who lack both coverage and services.


Our speaker, Roger L. Goldblatt, is Senior Advisor for Policy and Outreach of the FCC's Consumer & Governmental Affairs Bureau. His office focuses on how to better reach underserved segments of the population, such as children; rural residents; seniors; and non-English speaking, low-income, or disabled people.


Mr. Goldblatt will share insights and stories regarding his time as a leading official for the National Broadband Plan and as Director of Outreach during the switchover from analog to digital transmission. As a former Special Assistant to the White House Advisor on Consumer Affairs, he has lived through some major technology changes that raised difficult and controversial issues about the rules that should and should not govern communications channels.

Cancellations Due to Inclement Weather

If the Fairfax County Public Schools (FCPS) cancel school for the day due to inclement weather or other emergency, all LLI classes, Forums, and other activities, except trips, are cancelled regardless of class location. LLI morning classes are cancelled if the FCPS announces a 2-hour delay in class openings; LLI afternoon classes are cancelled if the FCPS announces early dismissal. Trips are cancelled at the discretion of the trip leader.

President's Message

tries very hard to meet its stated mission of providing ".. affordable and convenient opportunities for older adults to enjoy continuing education through the sharing of knowledge, talents and experience with their peers." We do this in a variety of ways — among them are our Forum, our classes, and our social events. But, thanks to a group of very dedicated volunteers, we also offer both day and overnight trips.

The LLI Trip Committee meets monthly on the first Monday to discuss present and future day and overnight trips. They glean ideas from themselves, other members, and from a previous Trip Committee survey. Once a possible trip is identified, the work begins. Two or three Committee members, serving as the planning team, begin researching potential trip dates, sites, tour guides, docents, restaurants, coach costs, and the like. Fortunately, over time the Committee has developed procedures and check lists that greatly assist the process. Many times the planning team has to actually make the trip to verify times and quality of what is being proposed. The process can take three to six months for a day trip and for overnight trips, up to a year.

Once the planning team has a rough estimate of the proposed trip's itinerary, times, and costs, they present their proposal to the Trip Committee as a whole for discussion, acceptance, and if required, Board approval. At that point, they proceed with final arrangements, composing flyers and write-ups to advertise in the catalog, the Forum and the newsletter. Finally, at the time of the trip, at least several members of the planning team accompany the trip, sharing various responsibilities to help ensure its smooth operation. Again, the use of check lists helps make sure that everyone receives a quality experience. Clearly, a lot of work goes into planning, setting up and conducting each of our LLI trips.

And who does this work? Of course, all are volunteers. Current members of the Trip Committee are Martie Klee, Anne Austin, Ferne Beyer, Linda LeDuc, Mary Jablonski, Kathryn O'Toole, Lynne Smaldone, and Mary Underwood. LLI Board member, Louise Blakely, serves as Board Liaison to the Trip Committee. We owe a great deal of thanks to these individuals for all they have done and continue to do to provide us with delightful travel experiences.

The Trip Committee is continuing to research bus companies, travel agents and interesting sites for possible future trips. So that LLI can continue to provide these outstanding experiences, the Trip Committee needs additional volunteers to assist with the many facets involved in the trip planning process. Even if you don't want to lead a trip, please feel free to join them for the fun of learning how it is all done.

AFAC serves some 1,500 families a week and is the only organization in Arlington dedicated solely to providing supplemental groceries to individuals and families in need. They simply cannot fulfill their mission without food donations such as ours.
- ➤ On December 13, Food for Others recognized our donation of 192 pounds of food we collected at the November Forum. Food for Others supports some 2,000 families, plus feeding hundreds every week night in 16 low-income neighborhoods. Additionally, they supply bulk food to 25 smaller food pantries and shelters in the community. They are helping others because we gave them the means to do it.



January 25: *Mercer Lake.* From Rolling Road, take the Fairfax County Parkway (state Rt. 286) going west to the Pohick exit. Do not turn left on Pohick but continue straight to Hooes Rd. and turn left there. Pass the first light at the intersection of Valleyfield Drive/Newington Forest Avenue, and look to the right for a small parking lot as you go down the hill. We will meet there. This will be a different route than the January 11 walk; both sides of the lake are appealing.

February 8: *Mason District Park.* Take Columbia Pike going east from Little River Turnpike. The park is on the right before Sleepy Hollow Rd. Turn right into the park, then turn right again and follow the road to the parking lot by the tennis courts. We'll walk from there.
