Inside China Today — Socially, Economically, Politically

w should we think of the rise of China and our relations with that country? Is there going to be a Chinese version of the Arab spring? Our guest speaker, Dr. Robert G. Sutter, is among the foremost China experts in the world, having authored 19 books and 200 articles on that country. His most recent book is *U.S.* —

Chinese Relations: Perilous Past, Pragmatic Present (Rowman and Littlefield 2010). His award winning survey, *Chinese Foreign Relations: Power and Policy since the Cold War*, came out as a third edition in 2012.

Dr. Sutter has been on the front lines of China analysis in such positions as National Intelligence Officer for East Asia and the Pacific at the U.S. Government's National Intelligence Council and as the China Division Director at the Department of State's Bureau of Intelligence and Research.

From 2001-2011, Dr. Sutter was known as a Hoya, Visiting Professor of Asian Studies at the School of Foreign Service, Georgetown University. Recently, however, he has switched his allegiance to the Colonials, as Professor of Practice of International Affairs at the Elliott School of International Affairs, George Washington University.

As usual, bring your most insightful questions to the Forum. Professor Robert Sutter can handle them.



believe one of the major strengths of our Lifetime Learning Institute is its diversity of educational and social offerings. Our Forum provides super guest speakers on a wide variety of interesting and timely topics. We offer classes, of both long and short duration, covering a range of topics from art and music to personal development and crafts. There are classes on government, politics, health, science, history, literature, and religion. We also offer social gatherings, and if you missed this year's Holiday Luncheon, you really missed a good one!

A different way you can become involved is through the Special Interest Groups or SIGs. As the name implies, individuals come together as a group on a mutually agreed schedule to participate in a function, craft, hobby, or area of interest. While LLI does not finance these groups or govern their activity except in the broadest sense, we do support them through advertising and by designating a board member to represent them at Board meetings. Currently, Peter Schwarzkopf is that representative.

Special Interest Groups are not static. That is to say, they form to serve an interest and as time passes if that interest wanes or has been satisfied, the group disbands. As a result, the number of Special Interest Groups is constantly changing with new ones added and old ones closing out. Among our oldest are Bridge, Current Events (originally named Discussion) and Favorite Books. I'll give you a thumbnail sketch of each. You can learn more details, including points of contact, in this "**News & Views**" or our current program catalog.

There are currently nine SIGs. Arts and Smarts is unique because they visit local museums and art galleries, almost always with a docent from that facility. The LLI Bridge SIG does as the name implies, plays bridge at various skill level tables. The Current Events SIG provides lively discussions monthly. The Favorite Books Club discusses mutually read books. The Financial Discussion SIG tries to discover, among other things, where our money has gone. The French Conversation SIG allows its members to practice and improve their French. The Gourmand SIG gets together monthly for lunch at various restaurants. The Photography SIG, which is relatively new, focuses on helping its members improve their photography skills. And the Walkabouts SIG schedules walks to get us up and moving.


