As the largest part of the nation's higher education system, community colleges enroll more than 6 million students, and the numbers are growing rapidly. Community colleges feature affordable tuition, open admission policies, flexible course schedules, and convenient locations. They are particularly important for students who are older, working, or need remedial classes. Working with business, industry and government, community colleges create tailored training programs to meet economic needs like nursing, health information technology, advanced manufacturing, and "green" jobs.

Opened in 1964, and comprised of more than 75,000 students and 2,600 faculty and staff members, Northern Virginia Community College (NOVA) is the largest educational institution in Virginia, and the second largest community college in the United States. NOVA is also one of the most internationally diverse colleges with a student body consisting of individuals from more than 180 countries.

President's Message

ell, here we are — approaching the end of another successful year in LLI. In June, we award our scholarships; have our business meeting to elect the Board members; and approve a budget for the coming year. While LLI doesn't stop operating — in fact, far from it — we recognize that many of us have family and other commitments (travel and the like) during the summer. As a result, no Forums are scheduled during July and August and the number of class offerings (twenty-five this summer) is reduced by design. Even the Board, with the exception of one early July meeting, takes a break. The LLI pace slows just a bit.

The one area I ask we not slow down in is getting out the word about LLI. Each of us needs to let our friends, neighbors, and others know about LLI and what it can offer them. There are many reasons to do this. First, and most obvious, is that our membership is constantly changing. In past surveys, people have indicated that they leave LLI because of their health, health of a family member, or a move out of the area, all of which are normal conditions for seniors. Second, our ONLY source of revenue is from dues. Clearly, we want to keep them as reasonable as we can, but our expenses don't directly correlate to the size of our membership. For example, whether we have ten members attending a class or forty, the cost per use of that classroom remains the same. Up to a point, increased membership provides us more flexibility.

But by far, revenue is not the major reason for bringing in new members. As you have already seen as a member of LLI, we each bring a great deal to the organization. We all had "previous lives" with interesting occupations and experiences. And all of that has made us a richer organization. Well, new people will bring these same qualities. New people will bring new ideas, new "previous lives," and new experiences. New members add greatly to that pool of talent we constantly tap for instructors, group leaders, future ideas, and the like. Simply put, new members keep us vibrant as a group, so we are always evolving.

We currently have a very active ongoing publicity effort to get out the LLI word, but the personal touch means so much more. To assist in this effort, we have prepared a tri-fold pamphlet, which is designed to provide basic information about LLI, what we do, and how to join. Included with it is a sheet listing the 48 classes we had during the Winter/Spring session. This handy tool helps





Each one has a clear direction of what he or she wants to achieve in life; and each has made great sacrifices to attain those goals.

Leadership Scholarships

Cherise Britt is this year's winner of the \$2000 **Knox Singleton Leadership Scholarship,** and there is no question this young lady is destined for success. She already has her degree in dental hygiene, and now wants to make a greater impact in the world by studying public health. "Cherise is a natural leader," Paul C. Fitzgerald, Ph.D. and Honors Program Chair of NVCC, wrote in his recommendation letter. We thought so, too.

Angela Joy Impat is awarded a \$1000 Leadership Scholarship. Angela graduated as Salutatorian from her school in the Philippines, an achievement she credits to her parents, who set the bar high and expected only the best from her. An admitted math-fanatic, Angela looks to a future in finance and hopes to work for the World Bank. But she's not just about numbers; she re-energized the Filipino student club on campus to become more active and socially involved.

Academic Scholarships

Tracey Le is receiving a \$2,000 Academic Scholarship to further her studies in marketing and brand management. Tracey credits her success to learning from her mistakes, and this candid, open approach to life makes her a winner in the scholarship team's eyes. Her letters of recommendation were glowing, too. One professor said, "I would rank her in the top five percent of students I have had the privilege of teaching over the past four years."

Meilin Lu is awarded a \$1,000 scholarship toward additional studies in the United States, after receiving a B.A. in Russian language from a university in China. Because of the lack of employment opportunities here for someone who speaks Russian, she now concentrates on math, business and economic studies, hoping to become an actuary. A \$1,000 Academic Scholarship goes to **Karl Larsson**, originally from "an incredibly small town in northern Sweden," who has wanted to study in America since he was little. Now he's fulfilling that dream by studying arts and language at NNVC. A nominee for the All-USA Community College Academic team, Larsson has already been accepted at the prestigious Corcoran School of Art for next year. He specializes in combining various media to improve global communications to improve international understanding.

Pajareeporn Maneechot is also awarded a \$1,000 Academic Scholarship toward her studies in medicine. Pajareeporn follows her Buddhist ideals of living a life of high meaning through helping people who live in distant areas and those who don't have opportunities for health services. "Personally," she writes in her essay, "I think the idea of having free healthcare service is marvelous and honorable." We are pleased to be able to play a small role in helping her accomplish her vision.
