How Poverty and Inequality Endanger America. Are There Solutions?



Prof. Richard E. Rubenstein

Professor Richard E.
Rubenstein teaches at the
School for Conflict Analysis
and Resolution (S-CAR) at
George Mason University
and has been active in
resolving conflicts here and
all over the world for many
years. The author of eight
books, Professor Rubenstein
holds degrees from Harvard
College, Oxford University

(as a Rhodes Scholar), and received his Doctorate in Jurisprudence from Harvard Law School. While he is an active globe-trotter, this time he focuses attention on inequalities within the United States and the urgency of reducing current and future conflicts.

As the nation's oldest and largest conflict studies program, S-CAR studies the root causes of conflicts and strives to mediate and interrupt the cycles of violence. Putting theory into practice, the students undergo vigorous clinical training in the skills needed to work with people and disparate groups and parties from around the globe. S-CAR has pioneered books and articles about the situation in Syria; problem solving in Myanmar, China, Japan and the East China Sea; established a joint program with the University of Malta offering a Masters degree in Conflict resolution and Mediterranean Security; and recently hosted a conference, Searching for Peace and Stability in the Post Arab Spring.

This will be Dr. Rubenstein's second appearance at the LLI Forum, and, considering the reviews from his first, his presentation is not to be missed.

Ask the Board

Question:

Have you considered having the Forums on Fridays to avoid congestion in the parking garage?

Answer:

The problem is that the Ernst Center has to be self-funding and we do not pay anywhere near the fair charges. The school has the best chance of renting it on Thursday, Friday and the weekend so they required we meet earlier in the week. Wednesday was the best we could get so we chose that day.

Question:

What is the connection between the Trip Committee and the Board? Is it necessary for the Board to approve a suggested trip?

Answer:

No, the Board does not approve LLI day trips (overnight trips do require Board approval due to the large costs). However, the Board has a fiduciary interest in the Trip Committee work in that any expense obligations incurred by the Trip Committee must be paid by the Board using LLI funds. Otherwise the Trip Committee has free rein to plan a trip, choosing the destination and the proposed date. Additionally the Trip Committee estimates the fee per person for each trip so that all the trip costs will be covered.

When the Trip Committee has decided on a trip and the date for the trip, the Board Treasurer will assign a unique trip number so that individual checks and trip payments can be entered into the LLI financial system for tracking.

In short, the Board does not approve day trips, but is an interested party for these LLI trips.

Please Note: Parking is available in the parking garage (\$2/hour). Parking in B and C lots is by permit only. If no garage slots are available, a \$12 daily permit for the B lot is available at the office to the right just inside the garage entry gate.

President's Message

here did Lifetime Learning Institute of Northern Virginia come from? What's our history, our pedigree so to speak? Well, it's the result of some keen vision and a lot of hard work by a few dedicated people.

On September 27, 1995, Audrey Markham and Knox Singleton met with Dr. Richard J. Ernst, then President, NVCC, to discuss the need and opportunity for the college to sponsor the development of a new group for learning in retirement for older adults. George Mason University had such a program, but it was at maximum capacity and was considering capping its membership, while the need for this type of educational opportunity continued to grow. Dr. Ernst readily agreed with the caveat that, while there were no college funds available to finance such a program, Dr. Kay Haverkamp, Director of Continuing Education, would assist in making space available in the Community Cultural Center.

On November 20, 1995, a meeting was held in the Cultural Center for all persons interested in the development of LLI/NOVA; about 50 people attended and the interest was established. By March 13, 1996, LLI obtained its Virginia State Charter and advertised for a first membership meeting, which was held on May 20, 1996. After that meeting 38 people joined; a 12-member board of directors was elected; and LLI/NOVA was on its way!

The 1996 fall term started with 16 different courses, and interestingly enough, had a nice mixture of history, art, government issues, and the like. By April, 1997, LLI had 78 members and the summer "catalog" (put together by hand) contained 24 courses. By FY 1999 (July 1, 1998 – June 30, 1999), there were 130 members, with fall, winter/spring and summer catalogs each offering a wide variety of subjects, much like today.

Study/travel was a popular program right from the beginning and continues its popularity up to the present time. In September, 1997 LLI travelers went to Istanbul, Greek Isles, and Athens. In May, 1998, it was Vienna/Budapest/Prague and in July of that year, it was a Danube river cruise. Those were followed by a journey through Spain in May of 1999. The list continues, with one or two major trips annually, preceded by classes about the planned destination.

And believe it or not, we still have a number of current members who were either charter members or joined the first year. LLI would like to recognize

In spite of the slowly reviving economy, the U.S. Department of Agriculture finds that 35 million Americans live in households that experience hunger or are at risk of hunger. In Fairfax County alone there are 1500 homeless, 76,000 who are "food insecure" (about 7% of the population), and over 26,000 who receive help through the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP, formerly known as the Food Stamp Program). Food for Others, one of the groups we support with our donations, distributed 2.3 million pounds of food locally between July 2012 and June 2013. Even in a generally wealthy community, needs are great, and it is good that we are helping. Thank you.


