Older Americans Are Often Targets of Consumer Financial Fraud. How Does the Federal Government Assist in Combating This Issue?

The Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act requires establishing an office within the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau (CFPB) to address the needs of older Americans. That office, the Office of Financial Protection for Older Americans, is dedicated to helping older consumers make sound

financial decisions about issues such as retirement, home equity, or long-term care planning; protect their assets; and avoid financial abuse. The agency has already taken decisive actions in mortgage servicing, fraud and abuse in debt collections, fraudulent credit card enrollment tactics, and recovery of some damages to people who lost their homes through illegal foreclosures.

Our speaker, Nora Dowd Eisenhower, joined the CFPB to serve as the Assistant Director of its Office for Older Americans in August 2013. Prior to her current position, she served at the National Center for Benefits Outreach & Enrollment at the National Council on Aging. Her experience in working with older Americans extends to state and private levels, where she worked as Secretary of the Pennsylvania Department of Aging; as Executive Director for AARP Pennsylvania; and earlier in her career, at the Center of Advocacy for the Rights and Interests of the Elderly and as deputy attorney general in the Bureau of Consumer Protection for Pennsylvania. She began her legal career as a staff attorney at the


