Top Science Educator Discusses How Chemical Principles Relate to Real World Applications



Reva A. Savkar, associate professor of chemistry at NOVA-Annandale, received the 2013 Chancellor's Award for Teaching Excellence. This annual award recognizes one teaching faculty member in the entire state-wide Virginia Community College System. "Throughout the years, she has

demonstrated a commitment to teaching excellence by being student-focused, innovative in the classroom and enthusiastic about her work," said Dr. Robert Templin, Jr., NOVA's president.

Savkar received her bachelor's degree in chemistry and physics, and a master's degree in organic chemistry, from the Institute of Science in Mumbai, India as well as a master's degree in computer science from Virginia Tech. An educational pioneer, she has been teaching chemistry and computer science courses at NOVA-Annandale since 1974 and developed the first online chemistry course in the United States in 1995. Her online courses are among the fastest growing classes for NOVA's Extended Learning Institute. For the past 17 years, Savkar has led the popular Science Seminar Series at the Annandale Campus, which brings together scientists outside of the College and in-house faculty to discuss science topics that affect the current day-to-day world.

Professor Savkar volunteers with a humanitarian organization, Maiti Nepal, and she recently traveled to Kathmandu, Nepal to set up a Learning Resource Center at a women's shelter for victims of sex



trafficking. If time permits in her science lecture, she may tell us about some of her experiences in Nepal.

So, brush up on the periodic table, and bring your questions to the June Forum to hear a most outstanding science educator.


June will be our last food drive until the September Forum. The recipient this month is the food pantry operated by the Annandale Christian Community for Action (ACCA). ACCA has served low income families in the Annandale/ Bailey's Cross Roads area since 1967. Currently, twenty-six churches

In addition to a food pantry, ACCA provides programs that assist needy families referred by Fairfax County or other organizations: emergency financial assistance, transportation to medical appointments, a furniture warehouse, Rebuilding Together, and meals for Bailey's Shelter. ACCA also supports a Child Development Center, which is the only program with paid staff.



a challenge, I can revise — I will be in Ireland from May 11 to 26).

May 30: Ellanor C. Lawrence Park, Chantilly. (Note change of date.) Hopefully it will be dry at the time of the walk, because it can get very muddy. It will take about 1/2 hour taking I-66 west to Rt. 28. Take Rt. 28 north, and then immediately turn right to Walney Road. On the left, you will find the Visitor's Center, about 1 mile ahead. It is worth the distance with a pond to circle. Do wear hiking boots or sturdier types than gym shoes.

June 13: Pohick Creek Stream Valley Park. Take Springfield/Franconia Parkway going west.

Pass Rolling Rd. and the next light is Whistler's Creek Dr. Turn left and then right on Hooes Rd. Almost immediately on your left will be a small parking area. Sign says Pohick Stream Valley Park. If you are traveling from the west on the Springfield/ Franconia Parkway, pass Gambrill Rd. exit, and then turn right onto Whistler's Creek Drive as noted above. There are pedestals to cross over the creek so you may want to bring walking sticks if you feel they help keep you balanced and wear sturdy shoes; also one big hill. Very nice, pretty walk.

June 27: Lake Accotink Park. Front entrance to park — Turn onto Highland St. from Backlick Rd. Follow signs to the park. Meet at the Marina parking lot area in front of the restrooms. We will hike on the north side of the lake.

July 11: The hike, on the south circle of **Lake Accotink Park**, will provide a view of an eagle's nest.






