

Drones Over America — Beyond Media Hype and Hyperbole

Unmanned aircraft systems (UAS), often called *drones*, used to be science fiction, but are now fact — an emerging technology and a burgeoning industry.

Today when we think of UAS, we tend to think of the military uses; but in the coming years, we will see these systems doing more

jobs where it's too dangerous, too remote or too expensive for crewed aircraft to go. Uses in search and rescue, oil and gas exploration, insurance, and agriculture will increase. Other uses may become commonplace, like filming sports events; exploring nature; home inspections; and yes, package delivery. On September 25, 2014, the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) granted six aerial photo and video production companies regulatory exemptions, the first step in allowing the film and television industry to use UAS in the U.S. National Airspace System. The prospect of widespread deployment of UAS in civil airspace is one of the most exciting and controversial recent developments in aviation. It also poses some of the most intriguing and intractable challenges for aviation regulators and the American citizen, including:

- How should UAS be regulated to ensure safe and efficient operations that do not interfere with existing air traffic or with people and objects on the ground?
- ➤ Is the UAS technology sufficiently developed to address safety concerns?

- > What are the liability and privacy implications of extensive deployment for commercial purposes and how should those concerns be addressed?
- ➤ Is the FAA prepared to meet the deadlines established by Congress for the integration of UAS into the National Airspace System?

Dr. Gerald Dillingham, Director of Civil Aviation Issues at the U.S. Government Accountability Office (GAO), the investigative arm of the U.S. Congress, will provide insights on some of the basic UAS issues and delve more deeply into what to expect over the next several years.

Dr. Dillingham oversees all GAO program evaluation and policy analysis related to commercial and general aviation safety, airport and airline finance, aviation and the environment, air traffic control system modernization, airport development, and international aviation issues. He has appeared as a witness more than 100 times before numerous committees of the U.S. Congress, and is recognized as an expert on aviation issues, program evaluation, and policy analysis.

Dr. Dillingham holds a BA in Sociology from Bowling Green State University, both a Master's and a Ph.D. in Sociology from the University of Chicago, and a postdoctoral certificate in Evaluation Research from the University of California-Los Angeles.

Come to the Forum to learn how these unmanned aircraft systems will become commonplace in the US. LLI members will also be able to observe, not sure about touching, one of the most popular types of "drones" known as a Quadcopter.




