planetary geologist at the Smithsonian's National Air and Space Museum, Dr. Jim Zimbelman gives public lectures on a variety of topics in planetary science for the Smithsonian Institution's lecture programs. A director of the Regional Planetary Image Facility and curator

for the *Exploring the Planets* gallery from 1989-2002, he also served as Chairman of the Mars Surveyor Instrument Review Panel (1995).

Dr. Zimbelman has written more than 80 articles in scientific publications and his planetary maps have been published by the U.S. Geological Survey. His research interests include topical geologic mapping of Mars and Venus; remote sensing of the terrestrial planets at visual, infrared, and radar wavelengths; lava flows on the planets; and a comparison of sand dunes on Earth and Mars.

Whenever Jim Zimbelman presents, science comes alive with some of the most recent, striking images of the planets. His Smithsonian spacecraft tour also will stop at a comet for discussions about the most recent NASA landing and the questions scientists hope to answer. The only possible downside to his lecture is that it may make sci-fi movies like <u>Interstellar</u> seem tame. Bring your curiosity, your questions, and perhaps your seat belts to the next Forum.





Date/Time: Fridays at noon. If the temperature is below freezing or the roads are icy, the walk will be cancelled.

January 9: Lake Mercer: From Fairfax County Parkway going west, take Pohick exit, and proceed westward to the Hooes exit over the parkway. Pass the first light (Newington/Valleyfield Drive) and then look to the right for a small parking area at the bottom of the hill. We start from there.

January 23: Dunn Loring — W&OD Trail: A new trail for the Walkabouts. From Arlington Blvd. (Rte. 50), take Cedar Lane north about 1½ - 2 miles before coming to the trail, which crosses Cedar Lane. Look for Grace Presbyterian Church on the right, then a small parking lot on the right next to the trail. Park there. If the lot is full, continue to the first street after the trail, Reflection Lane, where you can park on the street. We will walk on the trail toward Vienna.

February 13: Eakin Park: From Little River Turnpike, go north on Prosperity Ave. The park is on the right at the second dip in the road. We can walk either east or west on the Cross-County Trail.

February 27: Backyard of **Greenspring Community:** From Old Keene Mill Rd, take Rolling Rd. south and just before the Springfield-Franconia Parkway (Rte. 289), turn onto Hunter Village Dr. to your left which parallels Rolling Road for a brief distance and then goes to the east. Where the road curves to go northward, park around there on Hunter Village Dr. The CCT (Cross County Trail) crosses the road right around there.


