Resisting Oppression Through Culture and the Arts

ulture and the arts can be used for many purposes, both good and bad. In some situations, culture and the arts have been used to say "No" to evil with a loud or quiet voice. When unjustly accused people respond by cultural creation — by painting, writing, making music, or just by creative thinking — they are using culture to resist oppression. We often see it wherever people are

oppressed. Perhaps the clearest cases in recent history are in how some Jews and others responded to being incarcerated in ghettos or concentration camps.

The husband of Hilda Stern Cohen, a German Holocaust survivor, discovered her remarkable poetry and prose after her death in 1997. Our guest speaker, **Dr. William Gilcher,** worked with Hilda's husband, Dr. Werner V. Cohen, on two books, a large bilingual website, a tour of Europe with storyteller Gail Rosen, and a film documenting Hilda's story. Dr. Gilcher will also tell us about Izrael Lejzerowicz, a painter and poet of the Lodz Ghetto, who died in August 1944 at the time of the liquidation of the ghetto. He was credited by Hilda Stern Cohen and others as inspiration for their own survival, both as writers and as human beings. Why did he do what he did in the confines of the ghetto, with its extreme hunger, disease and cold?

William Gilcher earned his M.A. and Ph.D. in film history and criticism from the University of Iowa. In his presentation on culture and the arts as means of resistance, he will provide several examples from his own media-based projects. Dr. Gilcher is an innovative multi-lingual producer of international video and audio projects, as well as a programmer, translator, trainer, and composer with 40 years of experience in






