The Search and Rescue Mission to Nepal: Fairfax County's International and Domestic Disaster Team

hey were engaged in intensive training drills at Lorton, Virginia, when they received the

call to action. On April 25, 2015, a violent earthquake struck Nepal, flattening entire villages and setting off avalanches in the Himalayas. Thousands had been killed, injured, or were missing. The highly-trained people of Virginia Task Force 1 rushed to a Chantilly



warehouse to load their gear and once again, head off to a difficult mission. Then on May 12, 2015, while the team was still operating from Kathmandu, a massive aftershock in the Nepal region further complicated search and relief efforts. Mr. Michael Schaff, Battalion Chief of Virginia's Urban Search and Rescue Team, joined by other team members, will speak about the mission to Nepal and other recent disasters, such as Hurricane Sandy in 2012, the 2011 earthquake and tsunami in Japan, the 2010 earthquake in Haiti, flooding in Paraguay, the typhoon in the Philippines and many others.

How are the search and rescue missions planned? What are the various specialties on the team, how do they train and work together and how do they interact with locals on the ground and with other relief agencies? The presentation by Fire Chief Schaff will be a most graphic, interesting behind-the-scenes look at emergency preparedness.

## LLI Administrator Laura Charron Has Retired

ost of us have known Laura Charron as the LLI Administrator. She began working as a volunteer with the newly formed Lifetime Learning Institute in the mid-1990s; and as the organization determined over time that it needed a dedicated person to handle its core administrative functions, Laura assumed those duties and became LLI's first and only paid part-time contract employee. As Administrator for over 15 years, she implemented many of the operational procedures that have endured in this organization. In addition, during periods of heavy workload, she recruited a cadre of volunteers to assist her in various computer input operations, preparing high volume mailouts, handling registration and payments for special events, and other critical, time sensitive office duties. During the three times the LLI office was relocated on the Annandale campus, Laura was responsible for making the moves as seamless as possible while maintaining daily administrative duties. In addition to her duties, Laura led a course on the operation of the Naval Observatory and arranged for a nighttime tour of the facility.

Although Laura has decided not to renew her contract for 2016 because of personal reasons, we will still be seeing her at the Forum meetings. The entire LLI organization thanks you, Laura, for your many years of service. Enjoy your family and the extra free time!





## **Budget Presentation**

ue to an extremely full agenda at the past June's Forum, the annual budget for our July 1, 2015 – June 30, 2016 fiscal year (FY 2016) budget, approved by the Board of Directors, will instead be presented at the September Forum. Bob Huley, chair of the Budget and Finance Committee, will make the presentation and respond to any questions you may have. Please refer to a copy of the FY 2016 budget elsewhere in this newsletter.

Bob will discuss several key points. Among them are the following: (1) LLI income is derived only from membership dues and the projection is for 335 paid members; (2) despite conservative budgeting, expected expenses exceed projected income; (3) LLI has sufficient reserves to cover this deficit for the next several years; and (4) to address this shortfall in the near future, the most desirable solution is to increase membership rather than raising dues. If membership could be increased to 360, it is likely we could balance the budget, but currently we are below the 335 member projection. If you value and enjoy what LLI offers, recruiting new members needs to be a high priority for all of us.

### October 8, 2015, 10:00 a.m. – noon

Take advantage of a wonderful opportunity to get a behind-the-scenes tour of the Library of Congress, led by Mr. Ralph Ehrenburg, Chief of Geography & Map Division. Tour exhibition halls in the Jefferson Building Great Hall, which include the Gutenberg Bible, Jefferson Library, Kistak Gallery, Waldseemüller map (first document to name America), and the Great Hall overlook of the Main Reading Room, followed by the Geography & Map behind-the-scenes tour.

Our knowledgeable guide will point out dramatic vistas, cantilevered terraces, and the harmonious union of art and nature.


