Retired CIA Officer Discusses Intelligence-Gathering in the Revolutionary War — 1765 to 1783: Without George Washington's Spy Network, We Might All Be British!

enneth Daigler, author of Spies, Patriots, and Traitors: American Intelligence in the Revolutionary War, will discuss the intelligence endeavors of famous personalities such as Samuel Adams, George Washington, Benjamin Franklin, Nathan Hale, John Jay and Benedict Arnold. Mr. Daigler will explain the decisive role of intelligence in major battles such

as Massachusetts, New York, New Jersey, Pennsylvania and in General Nathanael Greene's campaign in South Carolina. He will also report on the intelligence role of African-Americans during the Revolution. The bedraggled Continental armies under George Washington might have been overwhelmed and defeated, except

for their resourcefulness and superior intelligence activities. He will address some of George Washington's crucial decisions, British mistakes, and spy techniques in use during this time.

Ken Daigler served as an operations officer in the CIA for nearly 20 years, including Chief of Station in the U.S. and abroad in high risk environments, and senior management positions at CIA Headquarters. He is recognized as an expert on Chinese counterintelligence and operational planning. He has a BA in History from Centre College and a MA in History from Maxwell School, Syracuse University.


Budget & Finance Committee — FY 2017 Budget

n compliance with LLI's bylaws, the Budget & Finance Committee is publishing LLI's FY 2017 (July 1, 2016 to June 30, 2017) budget (see page 9). We will present the budget at the June Forum/Business meeting. The income side of our budget is based on a conservative estimate of 355 paid members with the annual dues remaining at \$110. We currently have 365 members.

Our expenses are also conservatively estimated, but we expect 2017 to be a transition year. LLI is currently involved in a web site redesign project that we expect will automate some of our manual processes in addition to providing better information to our current and prospective members. This automation effort has the potential to reduce some current expenses. The FY 2017 budget has a line item for continued development as we implement our new web site environment. Most of our other expense line items are similar to prior years.

Our projected net income for the year is negative, i.e., we currently project a deficit for FY 2017. Because of very conservative financial management of LLI funds over the last 20 years, LLI currently has net assets (i.e., savings, both in an operations and an emergency fund) that will easily cover this projected deficit. Consequently, it is not necessary, at this point, to consider either raising dues or looking for reductions in expenses. LLI remains healthy financially, but the real key to continued organizational health is recruiting and retaining members.

Food for Others (FFO) is the designated recipient of the June Forum food donations. As one of the largest food distribution organizations in Northern Virginia, FFO provides about 2.8 million pounds of food annually to about 1,000 low income households each week.

Food is provided through a variety of programs: by referral from a social service agency which provides households in need with a 3-5 day emergency supply; by the U.S. Department of Agriculture; by volunteers who pick up food at the warehouse and bring it to 16 neighborhood sites in Arlington, Falls Church and Fairfax each night; and, in FY 2015, to more than 2000 children in 29 schools (20% of Fairfax County elementary schools) through the Power Pack Program, which provides two days' worth of food to low income students who might not otherwise have enough to eat on weekends. FFO also delivers bulk food items to 28 other community-based organizations, such as churches and shelters, to provide food for the homeless, homebound, and children from low-income homes. During FY 2015, FFO distributed nearly 250,000 pounds of food to community partners.

While all non-perishable donations are welcome, FFO is presently seeking donations of **canned fruit, canned chili,** and **pasta sauce.** Bev Portman will deliver the food.

Pat Harrison reports that our food donations to the Lorton Community Action Center in April totaled 181.6 lbs. valued at \$312.35. Thank you to all the donors — this was one of our largest collections.



Meet the Committees

s part of the ongoing occasional articles featuring our committees, this month we feature the LLI Trip Committee

The purpose of the Trip Committee is to provide locally-oriented days trips and short overnight trips that are of interest to LLI members. Established in 1998 by founding member Louise Sousk as an integral part of the LLI experience, the committee provides trips to a variety of museums, parks, art galleries, gardens, boat rides, historical sites and other places of interest in D.C., Maryland, Virginia, and other surrounding states.

One of the committee's greatest challenges is identifying and offering trips that appeal to a large number of members. Ideas for trips originate primarily from LLI members. The committee meets to consider these ideas and to discuss components, such as which destinations and itineraries might be of greatest interest to members, cost factors, travel distance, mode and source of transportation, whether there have been recent similar trips, time of year, and avoiding conflicts with other LLI activities such as Study/Travel trips. The number of trips planned and offered varies from year to year.

Some trips are planned and managed by LLI and others are planned by the Committee but provided by a vendor. For LLI-managed trips, registration and expenses are processed through LLI. For trips provided by a commercial vendor, all travel registration, expenses, and funds are handled by the vendor.

While trips planned by the Trip Committee are generally short, those sponsored by the Study/Travel group are much longer, usually require air travel, and are often to foreign destinations. LLI members who wish to can actively participate in the selection process for Study/Travel destinations, as well as choosing the tour companies that provide the itineraries, length of trips and time of year to take them. Activities planned by both the Trip Committee and Study/Travel offer the opportunity for participants to get to know each other better, to make new friends, and to see sights without worrying about logistical arrangements.
