How Does the Food Safety Modernization Act Impact the Safety of Our Food Supply?

ased on several LLI/NOVA membership surveys, food safety is the longtime most popular topic of interest. We are thrilled to have the Food and Drug Administration's (FDA's) Christopher A. Waldrop, Senior Public Health Educator in the Division of Public Health Informatics and Analytics at the Center for Food Safety and Applied Nutrition (CFSAN) as our

keynote for the October 7th Forum. Mr. Waldrop helps identify and assess emerging consumer research and educational needs, advises CFSAN staff on potential and emerging issues, and assists in prioritizing activities.

Mr. Waldrop will discuss the safety of America's food supply from farm-to-table to FDA's current plans for enhanced regulation and/or legislation. At a high level, we can learn about organic determinations and heavily chemically engineered foods. This is particularly important in light of the forthcoming implementation of the Food Safety Modernization Act, which equips the FDA with new authorities to regulate the way foods are grown, harvested and processed. The new law also significantly enhances FDA's ability to achieve greater oversight of the millions of food products coming into the United States from other countries each year.

Mr. Waldrop has an advertising degree from Texas Tech University and a Master of Public Health degree from Johns Hopkins University. From 2010 to 2013, he served on the FDA's Food Advisory Committee, which advises the Commissioner on emerging food safety, food science, nutrition, and other policy-related health issues. Earlier in his career, he served as a Peace Corps Volunteer in Ghana as a community health educator.


