ew realize that Native Americans have been our staunchest allies since the War for Independence from Great Britain. In fact, they have served, and continue to serve, at a higher rate in proportion to their population than any other American ethnic group, even though most Indians were not granted citizenship until after World War I, and in some states were not permitted to vote until the 1950's. If all U.S. citizens had volunteered for military service during World War II at the same rate as did American Indians, there would have been no need for the draft.



Dr. Herman J. Viola

Dr. Herman J. Viola, a LLI member, is curator emeritus at the Smithsonian's National Museum of Natural History. A specialist on the history of the American West, Dr. Viola served as director of the Museum's National Anthropological Archives, in addition to organizing two major exhibitions for the Smithsonian. Dr. Viola is the

author of Little Bighorn Remembered and Magnificent Voyagers: The U.S. Exploring Expedition, 1838-1842. Presently, Herman Viola is the senior advisor in charge of creating a National Native Americans Veterans Memorial on the Mall adjoining the National Museum of the American Indian. 




