*Bill Schneider, Formerly of CNN News,
Returns to the Forum to Analyze the
Post Election Political Scene in the U.S.
and Around the World*

This will be a most thought-provoking return engagement. On February 4, 2016, **Professor Bill Schneider** spoke to the Forum about “A Divided America: How Did We Get Here and How Do We Get Out of Here?” A leader among

pundits, Schneider foresaw the deep anger and frustrations in our society and the unusual political alliances being formed. Bill Schneider has been labeled “the nation’s election-meister” by the *Washington Times* and “the Aristotle of American politics” by the *Boston Globe*. *Campaigns & Elections* magazine called him “the most consistently intelligent analyst on television.” Now as the Donald

Trump Presidency is underway, Schneider returns to discuss the future of a divided America and the political and economic tensions around the world.

Mr. Schneider was a member of the CNN political team that won an Emmy for its 2006 election coverage and a Peabody for its 2008 coverage. In 2009, the International Foundation for Electoral Systems presented him with a special award “for his extensive coverage and keen insight of the 2008 United States presidential elections...showcasing

Rick Daniels has been actively researching the concept of Aging in Place with the possibility of incorporating some aspects of the program into LLI/NOVA member activities. I was unaware of the number of Aging in Place programs that exist in our area. The Washington Area Village Exchange (WAVE) identifies more than 50 organized *Village and At Home* programs in neighborhoods across the region. The WAVE web site describes their mission as follows:

WAVE envisions a world/region where anyone can grow older living in his/her own community, knowing neighbors, having the opportunity to be an active contributor to that community, and getting support from neighbors, friends and community organizations.

After meeting with the Lake Barcroft Village founder and current administrator, Rick and I have gained insight on how a volunteer based Village program works. Lake Barcroft is a well-defined community, which LLI/NOVA is not; however, there are *Hub-and-Spoke* options that exist in some areas. I understand that our Curriculum Committee has offered classes on Aging in Place and the *Village* concept in past years, which have been well received. I would like to gauge the level of LLI member interest before any future planning of Aging in Place activities are considered. Rick has developed a short statement which explains activities we could consider providing with interested volunteers. I encourage you to complete the survey enclosed in this newsletter.

Introducing LLI — Aging in Place

Sooner or later when we enter our sixties, we begin thinking about where we want to live. We ask ourselves: How will I care for my spouse? For myself? For my home? For my pet? With the thought in mind that, "There's no place like home," we ask, what should I do? What are my options?

LLI is considering forming a group to help LLI members resolve these questions with our primary focus on Aging in Place. This group will be limited to providing a list of professional services and businesses that can assist the needs of our aging members. It is our intent to provide references so each member can individually contract with the vendor they choose. The compilation of vendor services will include a description of the services and, where possible, LLI member evaluation of the vendor.

Today, in the Washington metropolitan area there are 50 Aging in Place Villages which are active or under development. They are generally restricted to a community, so our effort will be geographically much larger. Many of these Villages include volunteer members who assist other members with their needs. If there is interest, we may also add LLI volunteer members to the list of service providers in the future.

The services we feel are important to aging in place include:

- Activities — Social, intellectual and physical. We believe the most important aspect of aging is keeping an active body and mind while maintaining a healthy social interaction. Coincidentally, this is the charter of LLI and this service is available with the membership.
- Transportation
- Home maintenance – exterior and interior
- Home downsizing, modification and relocation
- Food acquisition and preparation
- Health care professionals
- Financial and legal advice

Included in this newsletter (see page 8) is a survey to assess the interest of LLI members in an Aging in Place effort from helping to organize and plan, needing the service or helping to provide the services.
