The exciting debate will examine (1) educational preparation and qualifications to become the greatest dramatist and poet of all time; (2) foreign travel in the lands where the plays are set; (3) documented lifetime experiences which appear in the plays; and (4) the international quest for the missing manuscripts — the smoking gun of

literature. Why is the authorship controversy important and how might it affect our in depth understanding of the plays? The lecture will be lively, a bit theatrical, controversial, fascinating and fun, because even if Shakespeare is not your cup of tea, everybody loves a good mystery.

Joseph Pincus has headed the Forum Committee since September 2007 — ten years of service to LLI. He is a Phi Beta Kappa, Fulbright Scholar to Queen Mary College in London and president of the NOVA College Orchestra, in which he plays cello.



We have a membership level that is not only sustained, but has modest growth. We are living within our budget plan, forum attendance is up, class registrations are excellent, and we can be very proud of our community support. A huge load of appreciation goes to all the individual contributions and volunteering efforts that define our success. Our LLI Organization Chart has 76 names attached to our activities, and many are repeated more than once. Add to this number more than 100 names of committee members and special interest group participants and you realize all the effort that goes into a successful organization. This food pantry distributes an average of 1900 pounds of food monthly, except in November and December, when 4000 pounds are collected and distributed in these months. Most of the collected food is distributed to organizations such as Christ House, Ronald McDonald House, and Lorton Cares, as well as near-by families.

The greatest need at this time is for the "Power Pack" program which provides food to children who do not get three regular meals a day, especially during the summer. Needed are nutritious individual packages or containers of canned fruit, meat, cheese and crackers, granola bars, and luncheon meats — items that can be put together to create a healthy meal. Of course, any non-perishable food is welcomed.

Mary Lu and Ray Bednarsky will deliver our donations. To each of you who has contributed food this year, thank you. We are doing our part to ease the pockets of hunger and food insecurity that exist in our region.





Budget & Finance Committee — FY 2018 Budget

rinance Committee is publishing LLI's FY 2018 (July 1, 2017 to June 30, 2018) budget (see page 9), which was approved by the Board of Directors on April 14, 2017. The budget will be presented at the June Forum/Annual Membership meeting. The income side of our budget is based on a conservative estimate of 380 paid members during the year with the annual dues remaining at \$110. We currently have 384 members.

Our expenses are also conservatively estimated, but we expect 2018 to be a transition year. LLI is currently involved in a web site redesign project that we expect will automate some of our manual processes, in addition to providing better information to our current and prospective members. This automation effort has the potential to reduce some current expenses. The FY 2018 budget has a line item for continued development of our new web site environment. Most of our other expense line items are very similar to prior years.

As you will note, our projected net income is zero, i.e., we currently project that our income will cover all our expenses in FY 2018. Because of very conservative financial management of LLI funds during the last 20 years, LLI currently has sufficient net assets (i.e., savings, both in an operations fund and an emergency fund) to easily offset any budget deficit, should one occur. LLI remains very healthy financially, but the real key to continued organizational health is recruiting and retaining members.



US Supreme Court Tour

The next closest is Union Station (0.5 miles). Enter through the left or right doors on the main plaza level of the Court; there may be a wait to go through security. We will meet on the ground floor, south entrance, at the large statue of Chief Justice John Marshall. Any of the Supreme Court police officers will be able to direct you.

If you care to have lunch after the tour, there is a cafeteria serving a variety of sandwiches, soups, salads, and beverages.
