Americans, a Major New Smithsonian Exhibition — Five Years in the Making — Is About to Open this October. The Curator of this Exhibit Takes Us on a Preview and Insider's Look.

écile R. Ganteaume, associate curator at the Smithsonian's National Museum of the American Indian, will talk about the museum's exhibition, Americans, which

opens on October 26, 2017. This major new exhibition examines the American peoples' real relationship with American Indians by exploring four events in U.S. history (Thanksgiving, Pocahontas, Trial of Tears and Battle of Little Bighorn), and how those events have contributed to shaping, if not defining, Americans' sense of

themselves. The imagery, stories, and accomplishments of American Indians are all around us: from sports to pop culture, to the arts, and industry. An interesting case, the Indian Motorcyle Company, was once the largest maker in the world and produced machines for the U.S. military in WWI, survived the Great Depression, and manufactured during WWII. Ganteaume will also highlight the exhibition's stunning and provocative design by co-curator Paul Chaat Smith.

Cécile Ganteaume, a recipient of a Secretary of the Smithsonian's Excellence in Research Award, curates and writes on American Indian art, culture, and history. With lead curator Paul Chaat Smith, she is co-curator of *Americans*. Her new book,

## President's Message

**LLI/NOVA** began the Fall season with a full calendar of events. The Information Fair was moved to the September Forum this year, providing a fresh start to our committees and special interest groups. The Information Fair was initiated two years ago as a one-stop shopping opportunity for new and current members to learn about our various activities and to consider participating in them. Fourteen of our activities were represented at this year's Information Fair. We also moved the Children's Book Collection to September to avoid any confusion with the annual Holiday Party toy collection. I want to thank Patti Volz for chairing the Information Fair and Lynne Smaldone, chair of the Favorite Books SIG, for heading up the Children's Book Collection. Both were assisted by Arlene Gribbon, Carol Weber, and Marianne Moerman.

Bob Huley informed me in mid-August that LLI had reached a modern day high of 400 "paid current" LLI/NOVA memberships. This is remarkable because we have been growing our membership primarily through our members talking to their friends. Our neighborhood meet-ups contributed to the gain as well and through these efforts we hope to achieve the modest growth needed to meet LLI operating costs.

Our Fall Class program began on September 13 with 44 classes and an excellent selection of topics. So attractive, that at this writing, we had 2,113 requests for classes. Unfortunately, 12 classes were over-subscribed with 303 applicants waitlisted. Small wait list numbers can usually be accommodated but this quarter they ranged from 20, to as high as 50 and 100%. The Curriculum Committee will look at changing the class location, securing a fourth classroom at the Ernst center, or offering a duplicate class, subject to the instructor's agreement.



# **Parking Garage Changes!**

#### Started September 11, 2017

t its September 8, 2017, LLI Board meeting, the Board learned that NVCC is going to a new Pay parking system for its campuses, including the parking garage at the Annandale campus where LLI has its Forum meetings and several of its classes.

#### How Is the Parking System Changing?

- After you park your car, you will now Pay in advance for your parking space at a kiosk in the garage or by using a smart phone.
- ➤ No more gates or waiting to pay a cashier upon departure.

#### Will the Price of Parking Be Affected?

- ➤ There is <u>NO CHANGE</u> to parking pricing: \$2.00 Per Hour \$10 Daily Max.
- PLEASE BE AWARE that campus Parking Enforcement will issue tickets for non-payment or overstaying your time!

#### When I Arrive, What Do I Do?

# Option 1 — Use Pay Station Kiosks in Garage

- ➤ Enter the garage and find an available numbered space.
- ➤ Go to the Pay Stations located on the 1st and 2nd floors of the garage (none on the 3rd floor) and insert payment for the time you will need to park your car.
- > Pay Stations accept the following payment types:
  - **♦** Cash (\$1, \$5, or \$10) or coins (\$1 or 25¢) or
  - Credit cards (Visa, Mastercard, or Amex).

- Please Note: Pay Stations <u>DO NOT</u> make change and there are <u>NO</u> REFUNDS.
- ➤ You do not need to display anything on your dash. Just Pay and Go!
- ➤ If you need more time than you paid for initially, take your receipt to one of the Pay Stations in the garage and follow the instructions to add additional time.

# Option 2 — Use Passport Parking Mobile Pay App

- > IF, but only if, using the Passport Parking Mobile Pay (Passport Parking) app, you also may park in the B Lots or in the upper garage (levels 4, 5 and 6)
- ➤ On your cell phone, download the Passport Parking Mobile Pay app or use the website <a href="https://ppprk.com/park/">https://ppprk.com/park/</a>.
- Sign up by entering your phone number, email address, or logging in with Facebook.
- ➤ On the "New Session" screen, enter the Campus Zone # for NVCC-Annandale campus garage 462 and your license plate.
- > On the "Length of Stay" screen, select "Choose Stay" to enter the amount of time you want to park.
- ➤ On the "Payment Method" screen, select "Credit/Debit Card."
- ➤ If you need to add more time, select "Active Session" or start a "New Session" to extend time.

#### OR

➤ On the "Payment Method" screen, select "Wallet" (iPhones) to see the flex-parking account "bundle" options (Android: Select "Wallet" and then "Add Account" to continue).

- ➤ Choose the offer you would like to buy and complete the payment process:
  - Option 1: 60 hours for \$70 (\$120 value)
  - Option 2: 30 hours for \$40 (\$60 value)
- Bundle hours will now be available to use from your Passport Parking wallet account for parking in the NVCC-Annandale Campus garage.
- Note that any remaining balance must be used by the end of the CURRENT semester (12-31-17). Be sure you will be able to use <u>ALL</u> hours purchased.
- > All sales are final after first use; no prorated refunds.

There is no change for Handicap parking. If you have a Handicap hang tag or license plate, you may park free in any Handicap space or in any space in the B Lots or the garage if a Handicap spot is not available.

In addition, parking is now FREE after 3:45 p.m. in the garage!

# Campus Parking for the Handicapped

NVCC does not issue special permits for using the parking spaces designated for the handicapped on the Annandale campus.
