President's Message

Memorandum of Understanding Between LLI/NOVA and NVCC

Our LLI relationship with our host Northern Virginia Community College (NVCC) is documented in an affiliation Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between our chapter President and the NVCC Vice President for Finance and Administration. As many of our members know, all Road Scholar Lifelong Learning Institute chapters are required to be affiliated with an institute of higher education and NVCC has been our host college since our founding in 1996. The Virginia General Assembly encourages the Commonwealth's institutes of higher education to support "Learning in Retirement." Why is this important now? Our current three-year agreement is due for re-negotiation before July 26, 2018. We have classes scheduled this summer that go beyond the current MOU.

The affiliation document lays out the responsibilities and commitments of both the College as well as LLI. For example, the MOU requires the college to provide space for meetings and social space on a *hierarchy of availability*. The highest priorities are fee paying, for-credit classes, workforce development courses, ESL, non-credit courses, and for-profit organization rentals. A lower priority is assigned for non-profit rentals, college group rentals, and affiliate group classes. When space is at a premium, it follows that the affiliate group does not fall high on the list. Fortunately, we are normally able to work within the agreement and have continued to have an excellent relationship with our host. The MOU encourages joint or cooperative programs of classes and attendance by college officials at our open Forums. The agreement also covers the reimbursable use of facilities and parking arrangements. Negotiations have been initiated with both NVCC Headquarters and the Ernst Community Center officials.

ur May community-based non-profit is the Arlington Food Assistance Center (AFAC) that provides supplemental groceries to our Arlington neighbors in need. Since 1988, AFAC has been dedicated to its simple but critical mission of obtaining and distributing groceries, directly and free of charge, to people living in Arlington, Virginia, who cannot afford to purchase enough food to meet their basic needs. The high cost of living in our region, combined with the current economic situation causes many families to struggle to make ends meet. Supplemental groceries from AFAC mean that families can remain in their homes, workers can stay on the job, children are ready to learn, and mothers and babies have the nutrition they need.

AFAC accepts most unopened, unexpired, and unprepared foods, including perishable items. AFAC is most in need of the following Heart Healthy items: Low Sodium products including tomatoes, canned tuna, canned beans and soups, and low sugar cereal.

Since AFAC was originally scheduled for February when the meeting was cancelled, we are happy to be able to support this food pantry in May. Patti Volz and Lois Spinello will be distributing the food to AFAC. Thank you for your generous donations as always. We continue to collect enough food to fill four grocery carts at each Forum.

There are only three stops for this exhibition (Musée d'Orsay, Paris; National Gallery of Art, WDC; and the National Portrait Gallery, London). This exhibition brings together 60 examples, *drawn from collections around the world*, of Cézanne's Portraits for the first exhibition devoted to the famed post-impressionist's portraits. June 12: National Gallery of Art: Private American Paintings (for those who missed the January outing), 10 a.m. — 12 p.m.: We will get an intimate look at selections from three centuries of American prints and drawings, unframed and without glazing. Among the artists we will see are Winslow Homer, Mary Cassatt, James McNeill Whistler, Georgia O'Keeffe, and Edward Hopper. Visitors are seated in two rows facing viewing stands arranged on study room tables.

June 14: Society of the Cincinnati/Anderson House and the Heurich House: 10 a.m. — 1:30 p.m. In the spring of 1905, Anderson House was completed and took its place as one of the capital city's most fashionable mansions, a "Florentine villa in the midst of American independence." The firm of Arthur Little and Herbert Browne of Boston designed the mansion as the winter residence of Larz Anderson, an American diplomat, and his wife, Isabel, an author and benefactress. For more than thirty years, the couple enjoyed their Washington home as a showcase for their art collection, and as a backdrop for high society galas.



n a few days, 25 LLI members and friends/ family will depart for a tour of the Dalmatian Coast called "Dubrovnik to Venice." Our second trip for early August 2018 will be a tour of the Canadian Maritimes. Information about these two trips is posted on the LLI website.
