Remembering the Cold War: Gary Powers, the American U-2 Pilot Shot Down During a High-Altitude Spy Mission over Russia, the Soviet Trial, and His Return Home.



Gary Powers, Jr.

After World War II came the Cold War. These were the turbulent years of political and military tension between the East and the West with the new threat of nuclear destruction looming over the world. We lived through the bomb shelter drills, the Cuban Missile crisis, the Berlin blockade, McCarthyism, crushing of the

Hungarian Revolution and the Korean War. An unforgettable crisis occurred in 1960 when the Soviets shot down a CIA technologically advanced U-2 spy plane piloted by Francis Gary Powers. Americans were riveted by Powers' tribulations, his return in a prisoner swap (featured in Steven Spielberg's movie *Bridge of Spies*) and Powers' harsh treatment by critics in Congress. Powers died in 1977 in a helicopter accident. However, his son Gary Powers, Jr., has researched his father's life and times and has some powerful information to share as our Forum speaker.

Gary Powers, Jr., is the Founder and Chairman Emeritus of The Cold War Museum, a 501(c) (3) charity located at Vint Hill, Virginia, 45 minutes west of Washington, DC. He founded the museum in 1996 to honor Cold War veterans, preserve Cold War history, and educate future generations about this time period. As Chairman of the Presidential Advisory Committee for the Cold War Theme Study he works with the National Park Service and leading Cold War experts to identify historic Cold War sites for commemorating, interpreting, and preservation.




