February LLI Forum

Stan Corey recognizes that retirement is too broad a term...it could entail 40-50 years...and no single financial plan can cover one's retirement years!



At our February Forum, Stan will highlight this aspect as presented in his recently published 2018 book, *When Work Becomes Optional*.

Planning for retirement is only reaching the half way point. We need to continue planning for the years in retirement in order to maintain control and not leave difficult decisions to someone else. Stan notes that retirement today bears little resemblance to that of a generation ago.

He breaks "retirement" into five major stages that everyone goes through at various points. At our Forum, Stan will place emphasis on the common pitfalls he has witnessed at each of these stages.

Stan Corey has been a Certified Financial Planner Professional (CFP), Chartered Financial Consultant (ChFC), and Certified Private Wealth Advisor (CPWA) and worked with families and small businesses for almost 40 years. Although retired from the day-to-day activity of providing financial advisory services, Stan remains a sought-after expert who regularly provides financial commentary (e.g., national conferences, in print and online publications, and on TV). He is also a "Featured Contributor" to a women's blog called "Sixty and Me" (sixtyandme.com) and his web site and blog links are Stan's website and Stan's Blog

Stan was born in New York City and grew up in Stony Brook on Long Island. He graduated from the American International College in Springfield, Massachusetts, joined the US NAVY in 1971, and was stationed at the Bethesda National Naval Medical Center, and then the Patuxent Naval Air Station, both in Maryland. Stan has been an avid sailor and navigating the seas has been his lifelong passion. He has sailed most of the East Coast, as well as to Bermuda, and competed in numerous sailing club and international regattas. He won the Naval District of Washington sailing championship in 1974 and became an ocean racing coach for the Naval Academy after his honorable discharge in 1976.

Stan currently lives in Great Falls, Virginia, with his wife, Jayme. They enjoy spending time with their adult children and grandchildren, as well as traveling, golfing, and an occasional sail with old friends.

Of course, we can update the demographics with the UVA Cooper Center for Public Service's recent report that says, "the growth in Virginia's population over age 65 is commonly recognized as the most significant demographic change currently taking place <u>across the US</u>." Between 2010 and 2030 Virginia's population age 65 and older is expected to almost double (976,937 to 1,803,404) thereby contributing to most of Virginia's population growth during the period. Cancellation-policy/inclement-weather

LLI/NOVA follows the lead of Fairfax County Public Schools (FCPS) regardless of the location of the class or event when schedules are changed due to inclement weather or area-wide emergencies:

- If the FCPS are open, all LLI/NOVA classes and events will be held.
- If the FCPS close, there will be no LLI/NOVA classes, SIGs, or Forums.
- If the FCPS delay morning opening, the LLI/NOVA morning classes, SIGs, and Forums are cancelled.
- If the FCPS close early, the afternoon LLI/NOVA classes and SIGs are cancelled.

Regardless of the weather or road conditions, every LLI/NOVA member must make his/her own decision about whether it is safe to travel. This includes our instructors.
