



#### US POPULATION PROJECTIONS TO 2050


Percentage by race and Hispanic origin

Number of immigrants in the U.S. and share of population








### Where Immigrants Came From, Then and Now

% of U.S. immigrants born in each region




### Immigrant share of U.S. population nears historic high




# Mexico, China and India are top birthplaces for immigrants in the U.S.

"You are patiently standing in a long line" for something you call the American dream. You are white, Christian, of modest means, and getting along in years. You are male. There are people of color behind you, and "in principle you wish them well." But you've waited long, worked hard, "and the line is barely moving."

Then "Look! You see people cutting in line ahead of you!" Who are these interlopers? "Some are black," others "immigrants, refugees." They get affirmative action, sympathy and welfare — "checks for the listless and idle." The government wants you to feel sorry for them. And who runs the government? "The biracial son of a lowincome single mother," and he's cheering on the line cutters. "The president and his wife are line cutters themselves." The liberal media mocks you as racist or homophobic.

Everywhere you look, "you feel betrayed."





Rates of worry have a strong and significant positive association with Trump's vote share, but this is offset by high levels of relatedness.





# BOWLING WITH TRUMP: ECONOMIC ANXIETY, RACIAL IDENTIFICATION, AND WELL-BEING IN THE 2016 PRESIDENTIAL ELECTION (Fabian, Breunig, DeNeve, 2020)



Worldview defense theories argue that a natural, often subconscious response to anxiety is to bolster feelings of in-group affiliation.

Self-determination theory similarly predicts that people feeling mentally unwell will seek to improve their sense of relatedness.


People with local, ready-to-hand sources of relatedness will be buffered against anxiety. However, those without immediate access to in-groups that can provide relatedness may reach for salient and accessible but broader in-groups, such as racial and national identity. Trump might appeal to such individuals with his America First, pro-white, and anti-immigrant rhetoric and policy positions. We therefore hypothesize that **Trump should be more electorally successful in counties with high rates of worry and low rates of relatedness.** 

We further hypothesize that an interaction between racial animus and relatedness should swamp the effect of racial animus alone, as this would indicate that rising racial sentiment reflected people seeking relatedness.





Distribution of Democrats and Republicans on a 10-item scale of political values









It's a unseasonably breezy Monday evening in January, and a handful of volunteers from Population Connection Action Fund have boarded the blue line at Foggy Bottom toward Largo Town Center. On the crowded Metro car, they wear t-shirts that say, "OUR FIGHT, OUR RIGHT, OUR FUTURE" and carry posters criticizing **President Trump**'s reinstatement of the so-called "global gag rule," a policy that blocks federal funding to organizations that provide abortion counseling to women abroad.

There's barely a day that goes by in Trump-era DC without an organized protest of some sort, often marked by clever signs and rallying cries. But what happens when these protests become so commonplace that people stop paying attention?

Tonight, the folks at Population Connection don't plan to gather a large group to protest Trump's "Global gag rule," nor do they have any chants planned. Instead, they're trying the hottest new form of dissent in the city: projecting their message directly onto the Trump International Hotel.





Except now, the men need each other, maybe more than ever -- and each will do whatever it takes to get another conservative on the Supreme Court.






