Lecture Series — **October Speaker**

The speaker for our October 6th lecture will be Dr. Ihssan Wali, the Cultural Attaché of the Embassy of the Arab Republic of Egypt to the United States. Dr. Wali, a widely recognized educator and scholar, has served as a Lecturer of English on the faculty of Mass Communications at Cairo University and the Sadat Academy. For the last 16 years, Dr. Wali was Director of Education in the **Egyptian National Commission** for UNESCO. As Cultural Attaché, Dr. Wali, an art and museum expert, has been responsible for establishing cultural contacts between Egyptian and American museums and arranging art exhibitions and cultural events to introduce recent trends in Egyptian art to American society.

Remember, the lectures are held at 10:00 a.m. in the Forum on the mezzanine of the Ernst Culture Center on the NVCC Annandale campus. There will be no parking fee.
