#### A Short Rewarding Day-Trip

LLI Members Marjorie Clark, Eileen Hurley, and Irmgard and George Staten went to Baltimore on October 9 to check out *The Flag House and 1812 Museum*. Marjorie did the driving while Eileen did the navigating.

They viewed the house of Mary Pickersgill, who handstitched the 30x40 foot flag that flew over Fort McHenry during the War of 1812. This flag inspired Francis Scott Key to pen the words of our national anthem. The well-kept brick building is furnished in the Federal style and has an interesting collection of Early American art. An adjacent museum commemorates the War of 1812 and features a short film and display of period uniforms, rifles, and sabers.



At the small museum store George bought a copy of Walter Lord's *The Dawn's Early Light*, which highlights military operations and shenanigans in and around Washington and Baltimore in the early 19th century. (If you plan to attend George's short course on the War of 1812, November 12 and 19, you'll undoubtedly hear about this book.)

After feasting on crab cakes at Phillip's Inner Harbor Restaurant, the foursome took a 90-minute cruise of the city's historic harbor aboard the Baltimore Patriot II. In keeping with the purpose of the excursion, they paid particular attention to the ship-side view of Fort McHenry, whose stout defense saved the city. The four LLI members enjoyed their academically inspired outing. Weather was perfect.

Admittance fee to the Flag House & Museum is \$3.00 for senior citizens. A ticket for the cruise is \$6.60.
