**LILE** March 4 Forum speaker is former Congressman Don Ritter, a seven-term United States Representative from Pennsylvania, who currently serves as Chairman and President of the National Environmental Policy Institute and as Chairman of the Afghanistan-America Foundation. The Honorable Mr. Ritter was one of the leading congressional proponents of U.S. assistance to the people of Afghanistan during the Soviet invasion and occupation. He will

discuss the role of the U.S. Congress in Middle East policy formulation.
