wo veteran legislators will give us an overview of happenings at the recent General Assembly. Over 1500 pieces of legislation were enacted in the 46-day 2003 session, which ended on February 22. Billed as a cantankerous session, many controversial issues were addressed such as the budget shortfall, inheritance tax relief, abortion, and guns, to name a few.

Delegate Jim Dillard (R-House District 41) is an influential member of the House, having served in it for over 30 years. He is Chairman of the Education Committee and a member of the Appropriation and Privileges & Elections Committees. He is one of five House conferees on the budget bill where the critical decisions are made on what's in and what's out of the final document.

Senator Leslie Byrne (D-Senate District 34) served three terms in the House of Delegates (1986-1992), one term in the U.S. House of Representatives (1993-1994), and has been a member of the Senate of Virginia since 2000. She was one of the senators who was doubled up during the 2001 redistricting when she
