If you missed Gary Crawford's presentation on President Lincoln at last year's February Forum, you have another chance to hear this expert talk about our 16th president. At our February 2 Forum, Gary will explore how Lincoln confronted the inner conflicts between the ideals of liberty expressed in the Declaration of Independence and the institution of slavery ordained by the Constitution. Gary, Executive Director of Ford's Theatre Historical Association, is a native Washingtonian and attended NOVA and George Washington University. President's Corner

We hope 2004 has started well for you; best wishes for continued good health and educational enrichment. LLI will mark its eighth year of operation during 2004 and is "alive and well." From a modest beginning in 1996, with 38 people, there are now 335 of us enjoying the results of the "pioneers" efforts to lay a sound foundation. A great deal of credit goes to the members who have worked, and are working, diligently to keep a viable and relevant member-run institute in operation.

It is appropriate at the beginning of a new year to take stock of one's assets and look to the future. Here are some of LLI's noteworthy "assets:"

- The curriculum continues to grow in variety and quality, as evidenced by the offerings during the current session: 37 courses taught by LLI members, current and retired college faculty, and other experts as volunteers. The several members serving as course coordinators ensure smooth operations.
- "Special Interest Groups" now total seven, and most likely a "Gourmet Foods Group" will be started soon. Participation in these groups offers a great opportunity to enjoy the company of your fellow members.
- LLI's domestic and international trips offer additional educational experiences.
- We have opportunities to socialize during three events each year: faculty/volunteer appreciation, picnic, and holiday luncheon.
- Recruiting new members requires little publicity, other than word of mouth. This approach works: 49 new members in the last seven months!
- LLI is on sound financial footing, even at the bargain price of \$100 for members' annual dues.

These are just a few examples of LLI's success, but we must not become complacent; consequently, the Board of Directors is taking a strategic look at how LLI might be operating when it celebrates its tenth anniversary in 2006. Board member Curt Kornblau and former Board member Memphis Norman are leading the planning process.
