Ambassador Haqqani is a diplomat, former advisor to Pakistani prime ministers, and a leading journalist. His syndicated column is published in the *Indian Express, Gulf News*, and *The Nation* (Pakistan). He holds a master's degree, with honors, in international relations from the University of Karachi.




If You Enjoy Good Music...


