The Lifetime Learning Institute of Northern Virginia (LLI) can proudly point to a successful year. From its modest beginning in 1996 when 38 people energetic people dedicated themselves to establishing an educational program for seniors LLI has grown to 339 members as of June 30, 2004.

It is important to reflect on how LLI has achieved its current membership level. An aggressive recruiting campaign was essential during the formative years. However, we are now able to maintain an acceptable (and operationally manageable) level with minimal advertising. "Word-of-mouth" publicity by our members is the ideal recruiting approach since it reflects member satisfaction.

Volunteerism in LLI continues to be very strong resulting in rewarding experiences and the ability to offer a wide-ranging program at the bargain annual cost of \$100. LLI is indeed fortunate to have the solid support of its sponsor—the Northern Virginia Community College (NVCC), Annandale campus. During this past year 16 faculty members offered classes. We continue to benefit from the support and guidance of the campus Provost, Dr. Barbara Saperstone. for Fiscal Year Ended 6/30/04

- > 339 people were members in good standing (248 women, 91 men).

Campus Renovations Underway & Planned

s you drive on campus, you are probably noticing some construction activity — the most prominent being near the Wakefield Chapel Road entrance. With the opening of the Medical Education Campus in Springfield financing became available for making several physical improvements on the Annandale campus. Noted below are the renovation activities that will take place in the coming months.

Over the next year a multi-level parking garage will be constructed near the Wakefield Chapel

Road entrance providing at least 500 spaces. Assignment of the spaces in this facility has not been determined. Please note that the Cultural Center lot where LLI parks for Forum meetings and on-campus classes will not be affected during construction.

- Renovations in the CT/TV-Tech Building, started last summer, will be completed in December. Computer labs will be consolidated and a few more classrooms will be available.
- From January until late summer 2005 the CN (Nursing) Building will be closed for a complete renovation.
- Starting in the fall 2005, the CS (Schuler) Building will be undergoing renovation for about 18 months. All of the science labs and science learning centers will be improved. LLI will permanently move its office from CS to another location on campus next fall.
- Upgrades to the cooling/heating systems in the CG (Godwin), CF (Food Service) and CC (Classroom) buildings are in the plans, as are landscaping and paving improvements.

These renovations are long overdue. We look forward to their completion. However, we anticipate having fewer LLI classes on campus during the next 18 to 24 months. Rest assured that your Board of Directors and the Curriculum Committee is committed to continue providing you with the same level of course offerings that you now enjoy.
