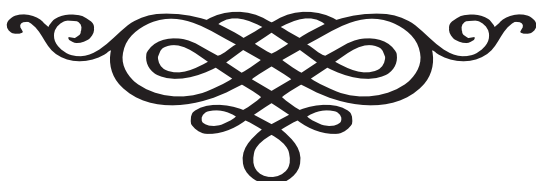

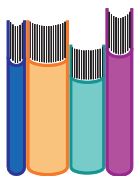
**September Play Dates:** Thursday, Sept. 13 and Wednesday, Sept. 26

Food for Others is the designated recipient of the LLI food donations collected at the August 28 Forum. As a regional food distribution organization, Food for Others distributes food throughout Northern Virginia in three ways: at their warehouse, emergency food is provided to families and individuals referred by social services organizations; every weeknight, food is distributed at 14 sites in high poverty neighborhoods in Arlington, Falls Church, and Fairfax; and throughout the year, bulk food distributions are provided to more than 40 community-based organizations, including churches, soup kitchens, homeless shelters, and day care and community centers. Currently, they especially need hot or cold cereal, canned fruit, peanut butter, jelly/jams, 1 or 2 pound bags of dried beans or rice, boxed rice (such as RiceARoni), and crackers. Bev Portman will deliver the LLI donations.

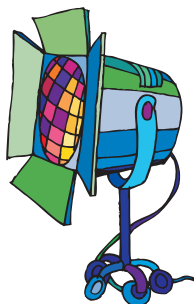

Attend all classes for which you have been registered. If you cannot attend, please notify the Course Coordinator, so that a wait-listed member may attend in your stead.

Course Coordinators usually call registrants of small classes (under 20 registrations) before the course starts. It is particularly important that you let the Course Coordinator know of your unavailability. It is embarrassing for all to have an Instructor prepare for a class of 15 and to arrive and find only 4 people in attendance. Please take your course registration and attendance at classes seriously.

The 2007 Northern Virginia Senior Olympics will be held Saturday, September 15 to Thursday, September 27. The events are open to residents 50-years-of-age-and-older as of December 31, 2007 living in the cities of Alexandria, Falls Church, and Fairfax, as well as the Counties of Arlington, Fairfax, Loudon, and Prince William. The events include sports such as bowling, golf, horseshoes, and swimming; games such as bridge, chess, and cribbage; line dancing, and much more. All events are held in local venues, for example, Bowl America Shirley, Wakefield Park and Audrey Moore RECenter, and Penderbrook Golf Club. To find out more, go to the website or call 703-491-2183. You can participate in the events, or be a spectator, or volunteer.

### Senior Metro FareCard

Senior citizens 65 and older, persons with disabilities, and customers with a Medicare card and valid photo ID ride for half the regular fare. On Metrorail, use a senior/disabled farecard or SmarTrip® card. On Metrobus, use a senior/disabled bus pass or SmarTrip® card or show your Metro ID or Medicare card and valid photo ID and pay the reduced fare.

For more information about qualifying for a Metro ID card and buying Reduced Fare farecards, SmarTrip® cards and passes, see Metro Senior ID and Metro Disability ID information or call 202/637-7000 (TTY 202/638-3780).

For visiting persons with disabilities who reside outside the WMATA service area, Metro will issue a one-time courtesy WMATA disability ID card good for up to one month and issued one-time only. The customer must present qualifying documentation at the Metro Headquarters Sales office only, at 600 Fifth Street, NW, Washington, D.C. 20001. The customer may also use a valid Medicare card and valid photo ID.

Visiting seniors who reside outside the WMATA service area must show photo ID that indicates their date of birth (65+) to be eligible.

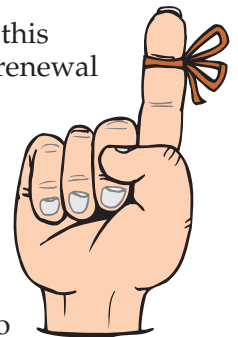
## Author David O. Stewart to Speak at NVCC-Annandale

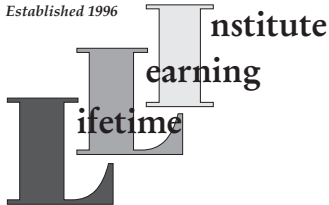
