Fourth Annual Retreat LLI's fifteen Board members and three LLI members who serve in key positions for operations met on July 26, 2001, for an all-day retreat at Greenspring Village's newest

building, Village Square. President Lorin Goodrich conducted the meeting.

- Discussions took place about each of the many areas related to the functioning of LLI.
- Memphis Norman in his review of the LLI Strategic Plan described the achievements of the past year as "outstanding" in meeting and working on our goals. (A copy of the Strategic Plan is available in the LLI office).
- John Manion, treasurer, and Richard Risk, budget planner, both presented reports indicating a very good financial condition. LLI members can look forward to fine programs, classes, events, and trips in the coming year.

Operational Responsibilities

- ➤ Laura Charron, our LLI administrator, emphasized the need for volunteers in the office, especially with the mailing jobs. She reported that Betty Mahon, LLI librarian, will be setting up a library system in the office to include pictures, videos, and articles about LLI. We are currently in our sixth year so preliminary plans were discussed for a tenth anniversary celebration.
- A motion passed to hold future Board meetings in the Annandale Campus' Provost's office so that the Board will meet consistently in one location.
- Most Board members will continue their respective areas of Board responsibilities. Non-board members, Louis Sousk, Trip Coordinator; Martie Klee, Volunteer Coordinator and Elderhostel (EIN) contact; Don Baynes and Charles Gorsey, auditors, will remain in these positions. Martie will work on finding volunteers to fill LLI positions and to help with necessary tasks.

Membership and Finances

LLI membership grew from 239 members on June 30, 2000 to 314 members as of June 30, 2001. Again this year there was discussion of how many members can be properly served, and it was decided to have a target of 300 members, rather than a cap on membership, at this time. The Board will continue to review the situation to ensure that class sizes remain at levels that allow interaction and opportunities

for socializing. Most membership renewals are due in August and September, and a new volunteer information form now being given to new LLI members will be distributed to all members for completion.

The operating budget is based on revenue from 300 members. The dues were increased July 1, 2001 to \$100 per person. LLI insurance coverage was explained: \$25,000 covers members in an LLI-related activity, and there is a \$1,000,000 umbrella policy for the organization.

Programs

- ➤ A high percentage of the membership attended classes during the last year. Several were taught by Instructors from NVCC, thereby meeting the goal of finding college-level faculty for some courses. Helen Clark and her committee completed planning the Fall session, coming up with twenty-six classes, but there are no science-related courses because instructors were not available.
- ➤ The first meeting to discuss Spring classes is scheduled for October 5, and volunteers are needed to help with program planning. Members interested in assisting with this process should contact the LLI office at (703) 503-0600.
- The monthly Forums, the post-Forum Lunch Bunch, and the special interest groups will continue in the coming year.
- Louise Sousk detailed several LLI trips, and presented a plan for a June 2002 visit to Philadelphia. Thirty-five people are needed for this trip, and a motion was approved authorizing Louise to pay the travel company the deposit for that number, which they require this October.


Outreach

- LLI has reached its target of 300 members, so future publicity will emphasize the Forum programs and our LLI web site.

- Virginia Fernbach presented an evaluation of the May luncheon. While the event was a great success, it is getting so large that the use of caterers should be considered in the future.
- Seventy people signed up to go to the August 5th picnic.
- The Christmas luncheon will be held at the Fort Myer Officers' Club, which comfortably accommodates a large group.
- The Financial Forum became more firmly established during the last year. Speakers addressed the group at each of the last four sessions and present ed valuable information.






