## How Are Breakthrough Discoveries in Genetics Changing the Face of Medicine?

Dr. Carla Easter, NIH Science Education Specialist with the National Human Genome Research Institute, will report on several surprises that scientists have learned as a result of the complete mapping of the human genome. She will present an overview of how genes are coded and will describe some promising research projects underway. Her talk will also address the following questions: How do researchers connect genes to particular functions or diseases, how are genes turned on or "expressed," and what are some of the most tangible benefits from our expanding knowledge? What exactly do we mean by personalized medicine? What are some of the ethical issues and challenges before us in the genetics revolution? Her presentation will be accompanied by free NIH brochures and will include the opportunity to ask questions and explore concerns.

At the February Forum, President Dick DiBuono announced that members donated 124 pounds of food to the Lorton Community Action Center in January. Thank you! Food pantries in the area are reporting low supplies and high demand. Our contributions are greatly needed and appreciated.

Food for Others is the designated recipient of the LLI food donations collected at the March 3, 2009, Forum. As a regional food distribution organization, Food for Others distributes food throughout Northern Virginia in three ways: at their warehouse, emergency food is provided to an average of 75-100 families and individuals each day who are referred by social services organizations. Every weeknight, food is distributed at more than 15 sites in high poverty neighborhoods in Arlington, Falls Church and Fairfax. Throughout the year, bulk food distributions are provided to many community-based organizations, including churches, soup kitchens, homeless shelters and day care and community centers. While all donations are appreciated, current needs include canned fruit, chili, tomatoes, and beans; and jellies or preserves. Bev Portman will deliver the LLI donations.


