Breakthrough Discoveries in Genetics Will Change the Face of Medicine

Dr. Carla Easter, NIH Science Education Specialist with the National Human Genome Research Institute, will report on several surprises that scientists have learned as a result of the complete mapping of the human genome. She will give an overview of how genes are coded and describe some promising research projects underway. How do researchers connect genes to particular functions or diseases, how are genes turned on or "expressed" and what are some of the most tangible benefits from our expanding knowledge? What exactly do we mean by personalized medicine? What are some of the ethical issues and challenges before us in the genetics revolution? Her presentation will be accompanied by a generous supply of free NIH brochures and include the opportunity to ask questions and explore concerns.

#### President's Message

his is my final message to you as your President. I hope the past two years have been for you, as they have been for me, a time of very enjoyable involvement in the many programs and activities of our fine Institute. Following our guest speaker's presentation at the June 2 Forum meeting, we will be conducting our Annual Meeting at which we will elect five members to the Board of Directors to fill the vacancies of those completing their three-year term of office in June, and elect our officers for the next operating year (July 1, 2009 through June 30, 2010). At that meeting you also will learn about the Board-approved fiscal year 2010 budget, a copy of which appears elsewhere in this newsletter. I encourage all of you to attend and participate in this important meeting.

Although a summary of LLI's activities and accomplishments during FY 2009, which ends June 30, will be presented in the August/September newsletter (no newsletter in July) I want to provide you with a few facts as we near the end of LLI's 13th operating year: We currently have 360 members; we've managed to hold our annual dues at the \$110 level for a third consecutive year; we conducted a successful year-long education program extending over three terms with 19 courses of instruction in the summer curriculum, 38 courses in the fall and 36 courses in the current winter-spring term; we have held seven very interesting Forum meetings (March was cancelled by weather and the eighth will be on June 2); we conducted seven day-trips, two overnight trips and 1 cruise; we gave \$9,000 in scholarships to NVCC students; we enjoyed a fall picnic and a holiday luncheon; we've sponsored eight very active special interest groups; we donated hundreds of pounds of food to charitable food banks and food kitchens; and we have secured use of the Ernst Cultural Center Forum and Seminar rooms at least through the end of 2010. These and more we've achieved through the vast volunteer efforts of our members with the administrative support of just one paid part-time person. I especially want to recognize and thank the members of the Board of Directors for their dedication to LLI and the support they provided me, my fellow officers for their diligence, support and leadership, our Administrator for the proficiency exercised in carrying out her duties, and most of all, everyone who gave me their friendship.

As I conclude my year as your president I am proud of our Institute and its accomplishments. Continuation of this success depends on all of you members volunteering for at least one activity or committee in the coming year.



Despite encouragement from family and friends to study medicine, as her GPA of 4.0 would easily permit, she considers that the relationship of a nurse to her patents is more important - ultimately she wants to obtain a doctorate in nursing

YOUSSEF ZAKI, winner of the second \$2,000 Academic Scholarship, is an electrical engineering student. Youssef worked in restaurants, gradually working his way up to more responsible positions, but realized he wanted to become an electrical engineer as a more fulfilling career. He too had a previous career, as Director of Business Development for a telecommunications firm. JONAS SHELLENBERGER, winner of the second \$1,000 Academic Scholarship, is majoring in respiratory therapy at the Medical Education Campus. He ultimately plans to become a doctor, after working as a respiratory therapist and earning a bachelor's degree in biology.
