# General Information

## What Is LLI?

Sponsored by Northern Virginia Community College (NVCC), Lifetime Learning Institute of Northern Virginia (LLI/NOVA) is a non-profit, member-run organization dedicated to providing continuing educational opportunities to older adults of all backgrounds and income levels. LLI/NOVA is a member of the Elderhostel Institute Network (EIN) and benefits from the services EIN provides in program development.

LLI membership is especially attractive to individuals 50 years old or older (retired or semi-retired), who are interested in pursuing intellectual enrichment and enjoying social interaction with their peers.

## LLI

- is governed and financed by members
- is supported by member-led planning, administration, and instruction
- provides non-credit, non-degree courses
- offers educational, cultural, and social events
- recognizes physical and mental health are major elements of vital aging.

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## How Are the Courses Organized?

Courses generally consist of one to ten 90-minute sessions, are informal, and frequently include group discussion. They are taught by outside faculty and by your fellow LLI members. Most courses are free to members, but some include assigned reading and purchase of a textbook, or require a small materials fee.

## When Are the Classes and Where?

Classes are offered throughout the year, subdivided into Winter/Spring, Summer, and Fall semesters. They are typically held on weekdays between the hours of 10 a.m. and 3 p.m. The courses are held on the NVCC Annandale campus and off-campus in churches, community centers and other suitable locations.

## Benefits of Membership

- Participation in courses and special interest groups throughout the year usually without charge.
- Participation in day and overnight trips at the special membership rate.
- Participation in the group overseas Study/Travel program.
- Attendance at social events such as the annual picnic, winter holiday luncheon and an appreciation event for faculty and volunteers.

## How Do I Become a Member and What is the Cost?

Complete the membership application form found on pages 29 and 31 and mail with your check to the address shown. The current annual membership fee is \$100. The membership period is for 12 months beginning with the month in which dues are paid.

## How Do I Register for Classes and Tours?

Complete a class registration form found on pages 25 and 27, listing the courses you wish to attend *in order of preference*. Mail to the LLI office with a self-addressed stamped envelope and any applicable fees as soon as possible; *registration for classes closes June 6, 2005*. Registration forms received after

that date will be considered only if there are spaces remaining in the courses you select. Your registration form will be mailed back to you in your self-addressed envelope shortly after the closing date, but in advance of the first class, indicating whether you have been accepted, wait-listed, or whether the class has been canceled. As a courtesy to other LLI members, please call the LLI office at (703) 503-0600 if you find that you will not be able to attend a course after you have been accepted. This will give members on a waiting list an opportunity to attend.

Registration for trips should be submitted on the separate forms provided. Please remember to sign the "Assumption of Risk and Acknowledgment of Responsibility" statement.

### Monthly Forums

Members and non-members are warmly welcomed as guests to attend the Monday Speakers Program and Open House Forum. The Forum is held monthly (except during the summer) at 10:00 a.m. in the Richard J. Ernst Community Cultural Center (see map on page 4) on the NVCC Annandale Campus. The Forum will be held on the first Monday in October, November, and December. Beginning in January 2006, the Forum will be held on the first Tuesday of each month.

For more information, call the LLI office at (703) 503-0600, and also see information in the LLI monthly newsletter. Persons attending these forums should park in the Cultural Center lot near the front of the Ernst Center. Look for temporary signs reading "LLI Parking."

### Class Cancellations

If there is inclement weather, LLI classes and other activities are canceled (**except for bus tours**) if the Fairfax County school system cancels school for the day, *regardless of the LLI class location and whether or not NVCC holds its regular college classes*. Listen for radio and TV announcements. LLI morning classes are canceled if the County announces a 2-hour delay in class openings. LLI afternoon classes are canceled if the County announces early dismissal. You will be notified of a schedule for "make-up" classes. 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## Directions to Class Locations — Fall 2005

The **Falls Church Presbyterian Church**, 225 East Broad Street, Falls Church.

#### *Directions from Beltway*

Take Arlington Boulevard (Route 50) to Route 7 West at Seven Corners. Proceed west on Route 7, which is called Broad Street in the city of Falls Church. Drive several blocks to Fairfax Street North. Turn right and then left into the parking lot at the rear of the church. Enter door at back of the church.

**Goodwin House West**, 3440 South Jefferson Street, Falls Church (across Route 7, Leesburg Pike, from the Skyline Center complex).

*Since visitor parking is limited at Goodwin House West, you are encouraged to park behind the Giant Food Store located in the "Crossroads Place" Shopping Center.*

#### *Directions from Bailey's Crossroads (Intersection of Columbia Pike and Leesburg Pike)*

East on Route 7, Leesburg Pike; left at the traffic light at South Jefferson Street. South Jefferson Street is located between the "Crossroads Place" and "Leesburg Pike Plaza" shopping centers. Go to the first traffic light and turn left into the parking lot of the "Crossroads Place Shopping Center" where there are several stores, including Burlington Coat Factory and Giant Food. Drive to the left side of Giant Food; turn right at the corner of the store and park in one of the spaces along a fence line. A gate with a "Private Property" sign will be unlocked. Go through the gate to the main entrance of Goodwin House West (a 12-story brick building). It is only a short walk!

**Greenspring Village**, 7440 Spring Village Drive, Springfield.

#### *Directions from Annandale*

At the intersection of Little River Turnpike and Backlick Road, go south on Backlick Road. Follow Backlick Road for approximately four miles to the sign for Franconia-Springfield Parkway (Route 7900). Take the first right onto the Parkway, going west. At the first traffic light, turn right onto Spring Village Drive.

#### *Directions from Braddock Road*

From Kings Park Shopping Center, drive south on Rolling Road for four miles to the Franconia-Springfield Parkway (Route 7900). Exit left at the second traffic light for the Parkway south. Continue one mile; turn left at the traffic light onto Spring Village Drive.

**IMPORTANT:** At the guard gate, inform the attendant that you are attending a "Lifetime Learning Institute" class at Village Square.

**James Lee Community Center**, 2855 Annandale Road, Falls Church

#### *Directions from the Beltway*

Take Arlington Blvd. (Rte. 50) towards Fall Church to Annandale Road. Turn left on Annandale Road (going towards the center of Falls Church) to a traffic light at James Lee Street. Turn right into the parking lot. Please enter the building on the parking lot side and take an immediate right to the classrooms. Room 112, for the Archaeology class, is on the right side of the corridor. Room 113, for the Living Wills class, is on the left side of the corridor.

**Little River United Church of Christ**, 8410 Little River Turnpike, Annandale.

#### *Directions from the Beltway*

West on Little River Turnpike (Route 236) to the second traffic light (you will see the NVCC campus on the left). Turn right at the light and follow the road to the church parking lot.

*Directions from Wakefield Chapel Road*

Turn right onto Little River Turnpike (Route 236) and get into the left lane. Turn left at the first traffic light and follow the road to the church parking lot.

**Mason District Governmental Center**, 6507 Columbia Pike, Annandale.

*Directions from the Beltway*

East on Little River Turnpike (Route 236). Turn left onto John Marr Drive (next light after passing Giant Food on the left). Turn right at the next light, which is Columbia Pike. Go through several traffic lights. Following the traffic light at the intersection with Whispering Lane, there is a sign in the median reading "Fairfax County Police Station." Proceed a short distance and turn right into the parking lot of the Center.

**Meadowlark Botanical Gardens**, Beulah Road, Vienna.

*Directions from the Beltway (I-495 toward Baltimore)*

Exit onto Route 123 South (Chain Bridge Road); pass Tysons Corner Center on your left and Tysons II on your right. Continue on Route 123 to the intersection with Old Courthouse Road (traffic light), and turn right. **Immediately** move into the **left** lane and then turn left at the next traffic light where Old Courthouse Road turns left. Continue on Old Courthouse Road for 2.3 miles to a four-way stop sign and intersection with Beulah Road. Proceed straight ahead (which is now Beulah Road) for 0.8 miles to Meadowlark Gardens on your left; turn into Meadowlark Court and parking lot.

**NVCC Campus Buildings**

(Refer to campus map on p. 4.)

Parking for all Campus Classes and Activities:

**PLEASE PARK IN THE LOT RESERVED FOR THE CULTURAL CENTER (THE LOT WITH THE ARM-TYPE GATES).** If the gate is closed, push the button in the yellow box for entry. You will receive a token at the class to be used for exiting, or the exit gate will be raised by the time the class session ends.

**Ernst Community Cultural Center (CE)**, also called the NVCC Cultural Center, Annandale Campus, building marked "1" on the map. The Forum is the large open space (with fireplace) on the mezzanine

level. Seminar rooms are on the mezzanine level adjacent to the Forum. The Dance Room is located on the first floor behind the elevator.

**NVCC Food Service Building (CF)**, marked "6" on the map, Chestnut Hill Room. Enter on plaza level. Turn left through the Faculty Dining Room.

**NVCC McDiarmid Building (CM)**, marked "2" on the map.

**St. Matthew's United Methodist Church**, 8617 Little River Turnpike, Annandale.

*Directions from the Beltway*

West on Little River Turnpike (Route 236). Pass the NVCC campus and Wakefield Chapel Road (second and third traffic lights). Take the next left (which does not have a traffic light) onto Wakefield Drive; immediately turn right and then left into the church parking lot. Park in spaces near the left-hand side of the church since you will be entering the building through a basement door on the left side.

*Directions from Braddock Road going East*

Turn left onto Wakefield Chapel Road. Continue for approximately 1.3 miles (passing NVCC on the right) and turn left onto Virginia Avenue. At the stop sign turn right onto Wakefield Drive and then turn left into the church parking lot.

**The Virginian**, 9259 Arlington Blvd. (Route 50), Fairfax.

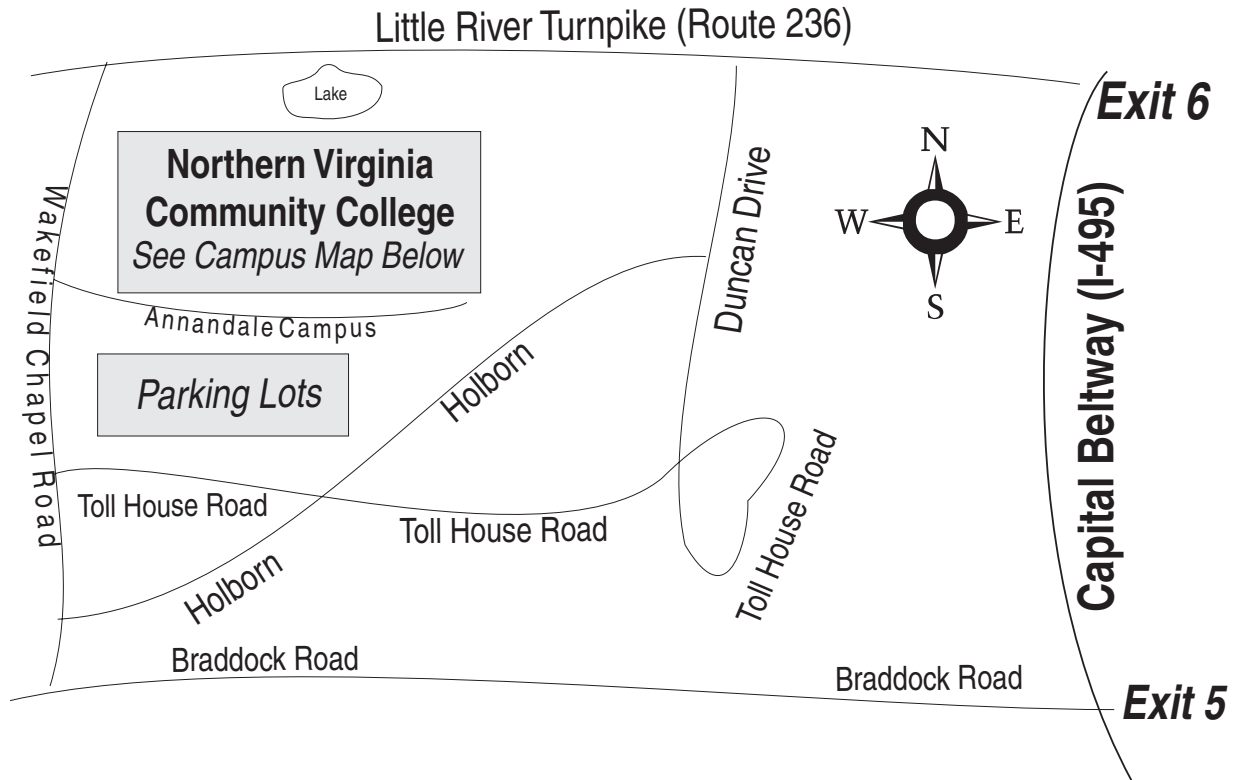
*Directions from Little River Turnpike (Route 236)*

Take Route 236 West to Pickett Road (Fair City Mall). Take a right and go 1.5 miles to Arlington Blvd. Take a right. Go to the first traffic light and turn right. There is a circle. Take the first right off the circle into the parking area.

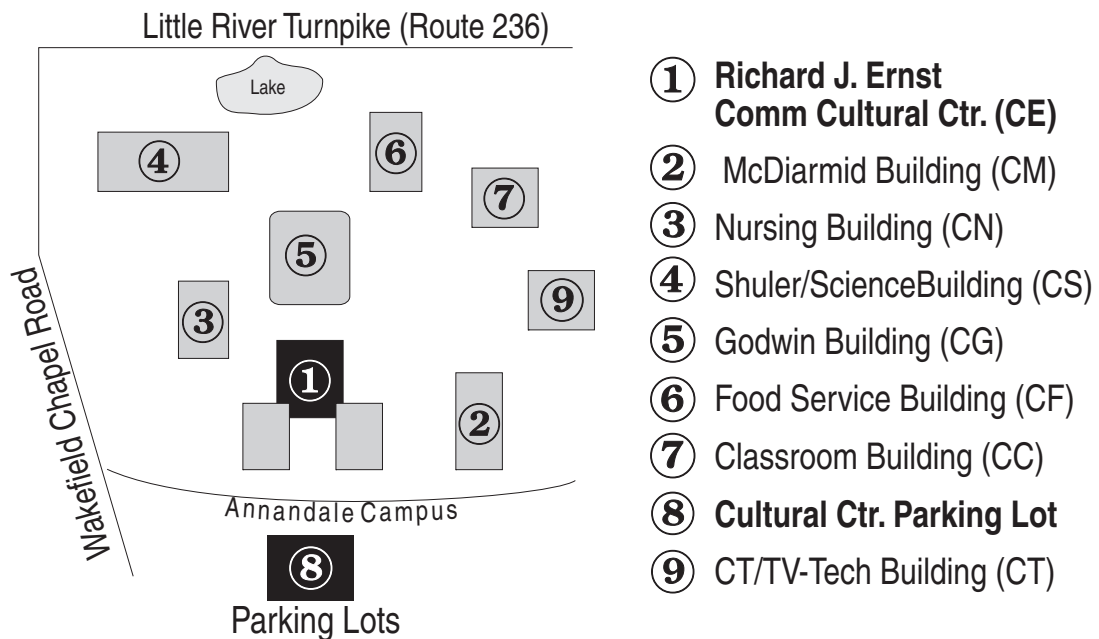
*Directions from Beltway via Arlington Blvd. (Route 50)*

Go west on Arlington Blvd. Stay on Arlington Blvd. past Nutley Street (approximately 2 miles). At the first traffic light after Nutley Street, turn left into The Virginian's driveway. Follow signs for visitor parking which is off toward the right once you see The Virginian.

Chemical and biological warfare: a short history, case studies, whether chemical and biological agents are considered WMD.

Iraq situation: events between the first and second "wars," how and why the 2002 estimate went wrong.

The pomp and splendor of the French First Empire, its classical themes and motifs, and the marvels produced by the Romantic revival following Napoleon's fall will be highlighted during this lecture. Also included will be the remarkable jewels

made by the great French Romantic master jewelers.

**November 17** “1850-1890: Rampant Revivalism;” plus “How the French Crown Jewels Came to America.” This lecture will cover the luxury of the French Second Empire, followed by the French Third Republic’s decision to auction off the French Crown Diamonds in 1887. We’ll also see how the bulk of these great jewels ended up in the U.S. after Tiffany & Company won one-third of them at auction and rapidly sold them to its super-rich American clientele.
