How Are the Courses Organized?

Courses generally consist of one to ten 90-minute sessions, are informal, and frequently include group discussion. They are taught by outside faculty and by your fellow LLI members. Most courses are free to members, but some include assigned reading and purchase of a textbook, or require a small materials fee.

When Are the Classes and Where?

Classes are offered throughout the year, subdivided into Winter/Spring, Summer, and Fall semesters. They are typically held on weekdays between the hours of 10 a.m. and 3 p.m. The courses are held on the NVCC Annandale campus and off-campus in churches, community centers and other suitable locations.

How Do I Become a Member and What is the Cost?

Complete the membership application form found on pages 21 and 23 and mail with your check to the address shown. The current annual membership fee is \$100. The membership period is for 12 months beginning with the month in which dues are paid.

How Do I Register for Classes and Tours?

Complete a class registration form found on pages 17 and 19, listing the courses you wish to attend *in order of preference*. Mail to the LLI office with a self-addressed stamped envelope and any applicable fees as soon as possible; **registration for classes closes June 6, 2005**. Registration forms received after that date will be considered only if there are spaces remaining in the courses you select. Your registration form will be mailed back to you in your self-addressed envelope shortly after the closing date, but in advance of the first class, indicating whether you have been accepted, wait-listed, or whether the class has been canceled. As a courtesy to other LLI members, please call the LLI office at (703) 503-0600 if you find that you will not be able to attend a course after you have been accepted. This will give members on a waiting list an opportunity to attend.

Registration for trips should be submitted on the separate forms provided. Please remember to sign the "Assumption of Risk and Acknowledgment of Responsibility" statement.

Monthly Forums

Members and non-members are warmly welcomed as guests to attend the Monday Speakers Program and Open House forum. The forums are held monthly (except during the summer) on the first Monday at 10:00 a.m. in the Richard J. Ernst Community Cultural Center (see map on page 4) on the NVCC Annandale Campus. For more information, call the LLI office (703) 503-0600, and also see information in the LLI monthly newsletter, Golden Gazette and other local publications. Persons attending these forums should park in the Cultural Center lot near the front of the Ernst Center. Look for temporary signs reading "LLI Parking."

Class Cancellations

If there is inclement weather, LLI classes and other activities are canceled (**except for bus tours**) if the Fairfax County school system cancels school for the day, *regardless of the LLI class location and whether or not NVCC holds its regular college classes*. Listen for radio and TV announcements. LLI morning classes are canceled if the County announces a 2-hour delay in class openings. LLI afternoon classes are canceled if the County announces early dismissal. You will be notified of a schedule for "make-up" classes. For bus tours, please contact the tour leader (listed in the program booklet).

Directions to Class Locations — Summer 2005

Calvary Hill Baptist Church, 9301 Little River Turnpike, Fairfax.

Directions from Wakefield Chapel Road.

Turn left on Little River Turnpike (Rte 236). Go to the fourth traffic light (1.5 miles) to Olley Lane and turn left. Turn right into the second driveway at the church parking lot (approximately 100 yards after turning onto Olley Lane). The main entrance to the church is at the far end of the parking lot. The Fellowship Hall is the first room on the left.

Chapel Square Center, 4401 Holborn Avenue, Annandale.

Directions from Little River Turnpike

Turn onto Wakefield Chapel Road and pass the NVCC campus to Toll House Road (third street on the left after passing the campus parking lot). Left onto Toll House Road to the first stop sign, Holborn Avenue. Left onto Holborn and go over a rise in the street. Chapel Square Center, a former elementary school, is on the left just beyond an athletic field. Park at the far end of the building or on Holborn Avenue. Enter through the main doors — Room 3 is the first room on the first left-hand corridor. Room 5 is the third room on this corridor.

Directions from Braddock Road

Turn onto Wakefield Chapel Road to the fourth right turn, Holborn Avenue. Continue on Holborn through the stop sign at Toll House Road. See directions above.

Goodwin House West, 3440 South Jefferson Street, Falls Church (across Route 7, Leesburg Pike, from the Skyline Center complex).

Since visitor parking is limited at Goodwin House West, you are encouraged to park behind the Giant Food Store located in the "Crossroads Place" Shopping Center.

Directions from Bailey's Crossroads (Intersection of Columbia Pike and Leesburg Pike)

East on Route 7, Leesburg Pike; left at the traffic light at South Jefferson Street. South Jefferson Street is located between the "Crossroads Place" and "Leesburg Pike Plaza" shopping centers. Go to the first traffic light and turn left into the parking lot of the "Crossroads Place Shopping Center" where there are several stores, including Burlington Coat Factory and Giant Food. Drive to the left side of Giant Food; turn right at the corner of the store and park in one of the spaces along a fence line. A gate with a "Private Property" sign will be unlocked. Go through the gate to the main entrance of Goodwin House West (a 12-story brick building). It is only a short walk!

Greenspring Village, 7440 Spring Village Drive, Springfield.

Directions from Annandale

At the intersection of Little River Turnpike and Backlick Road, go south on Backlick Road. Follow Backlick Road for approximately four miles to the sign for Franconia-Springfield Parkway (Route 7900). Take the first right onto the Parkway, going west. At the first traffic light turn right onto Spring Village Drive. At the guard gate, inform the attendant that you are attending a "Lifetime Learning Institute" class at Village Square.

Directions from Braddock Road

From Kings Park Shopping Center drive south on Rolling Road for four miles to the Franconia-Springfield Parkway (Route 7900). Exit left at the second traffic light for the Parkway south. Continue one mile; turn left at the traffic light onto Spring Village Drive. At the guard gate, follow the directions above.

Little River United Church of Christ, 8410 Little River Turnpike, Annandale.

Directions from the Beltway

West on Little River Turnpike (Route 236) to the second traffic light (you will see the NVCC campus on the left). Turn right at the light and follow the road to the church parking lot.

Directions from Wakefield Chapel Road

Turn right onto Little River Turnpike (Route 236) and get into the left lane. Turn left at the first traffic light and follow the road to the church parking lot.

Mason District Governmental Center, 6507 Columbia Pike, Annandale.

Directions from the Beltway

East on Little River Turnpike (Route 236). Turn left onto John Marr Drive (next light after passing Giant Food on the left). Turn right at the next light, which is Columbia Pike. Go through several traffic lights. Following the traffic light at the intersection with Whispering Lane, there is a sign in the median reading "Fairfax County Police Station." Proceed a short distance and turn right into the parking lot of the Center.

Meadowlark Botanical Gardens located on Beulah Road, Vienna.

Directions from the Beltway (I-495 toward Baltimore)

Exit onto Route 123 South (Chain Bridge Road); pass Tyson's Corner Center on your left and Tyson's II on your right. Continue on Route 123 to the intersection with Old Courthouse Road (traffic light), and turn right. **Immediately** move into the **left** lane and then turn left at the next traffic light where Old Courthouse Road turns left. Continue on Old Courthouse Road for 2.3 miles to a four-way stop sign and intersection with Beulah Road. Proceed straight ahead (which is now Beulah Road) for 0.8 miles to Meadowlark Gardens on your left; turn into Meadowlark Court and parking lot.

National Gallery of Art, 6th and Constitution Ave., N. W., Washington, D. C.

Closest Metro station is Archives/Navy Memorial (on the green and yellow lines).

NVCC Campus Buildings

(Refer to campus map on p. 4.)

Parking for all Campus Classes and Activities: **PLEASE PARK IN THE LOT RESERVED FOR THE CULTURAL CENTER (THE LOT WITH THE ARM-TYPE GATES)**. If the gate is closed, push the button in the yellow box for entry. You will receive a token at the class to be used for exiting, or the exit gate will be raised by the time the class session ends.

Ernst Community Cultural Center (CE), also called the NVCC Cultural Center, Annandale Campus, building marked "1" on the map. The Forum is the large open space (with fireplace) on the mezzanine level. Seminar rooms are on the mezzanine level adjacent to the Forum. The Dance Room is located on the first floor behind the elevator.

NVCC Food Service Building (CF), marked "6" on the map, Chestnut Hill Room. Enter on plaza level. Turn left through the Faculty Dining Room.

NVCC McDiarmid Building (CM), marked "2" on the map.

NVCC Shuler/Science Building (CS), marked "4" on the map. The LLI office is in this building (Room 238).

St. Matthew's United Methodist Church, 8617 Little River Turnpike, Annandale.

Directions from the Beltway

West on Little River Turnpike (Route 236). Pass the NVCC campus and Wakefield Chapel Road (second and third traffic lights). Take the next left (which does not have a traffic light) onto Wakefield Drive; immediately turn right and then left into the church parking lot. Park in spaces near the left-hand side of

the church since you will be entering the building through a basement door on the left side.

Directions from Braddock Road going East

Turn left onto Wakefield Chapel Road. Continue for approximately 1.3 miles (passing NVCC on the right) and turn left onto Virginia Avenue. At the stop sign turn right onto Wakefield Drive and then turn left into the church parking lot.

Sully Historic Site, 3601 Sully Road, Chantilly.

From the Beltway (I-495)

From the Beltway take Rt. 66 West to Rt. 28 North (exit 53B). Turn right at the end of the exit ramp onto Rt. 28. Go approximately 4 miles north on Rt. 28 and turn right just past the Rt. 50 exit. (DO NOT TURN ONTO RT. 50, STAY ON RT. 28.)

Alternate Route: Rt. 50 West all the way to Rt. 28. Go north on Rt. 28 less than one mile and turn right into the Sully Site.

Vola Lawson Animal Shelter, 4101 Eisenhower Avenue, Alexandria.

Directions from Beltway (I-495)

Go east on the Beltway to Exit 174, the Eisenhower Connector. At the end of the exit, turn right onto Eisenhower Avenue. The Shelter is approximately ½ mile ahead on the left.

Directions from the Landmark Mall/Duke Street area:

Going east on Duke Street, take the exit just past the Passport Dodge Car Dealership to Van Dorn Street. Turn right onto Van Dorn, continuing to the traffic light at Eisenhower Avenue (the light after passing the Vulcan stone quarry). Turn left onto Eisenhower Avenue and go approximately 2 miles to the Shelter on the left.

Woodlawn Plantation, 9000 Richmond Highway, Alexandria.

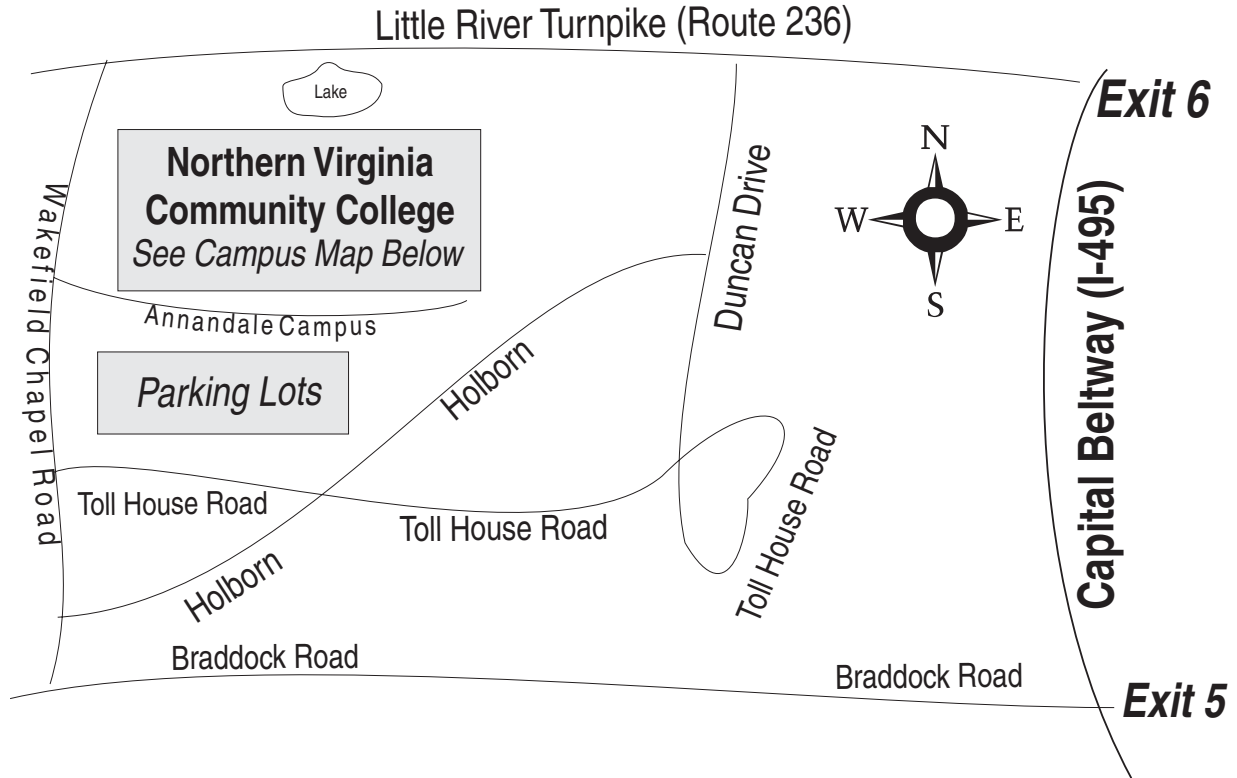
From Springfield:

Take I-395/95 South and exit at 116A (Fairfax County Parkway). Proceed on the parkway until you dead end at Rt. 1 – Richmond Highway. Turn left and go north to the intersection of Rt. 1 and State Road 234 (the 4th traffic light). Turn left into Woodlawn entrance.

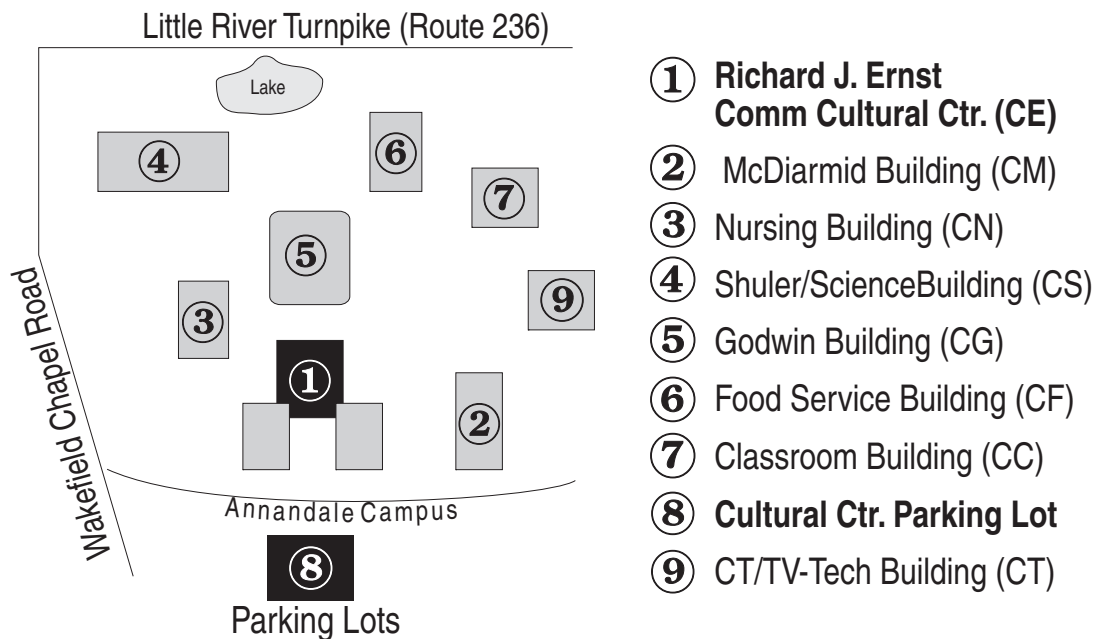
From Washington, D.C./Mount Vernon:

Follow the George Washington Parkway to Mount Vernon through Alexandria. At the traffic circle at Mount Vernon, bear to the right and stay in the center lane. At the stop sign continue straight onto Rt. 235 South. Stay on Rt. 235 until it intersects with Rt. 1 (approximately 3 miles) to the entrance to Woodlawn.

Course 5S01A Jewelry: Mirror of Its Times (3 Sessions)

A feast for the eye and the mind alike — what could be better? This very popular course offers a continuing journey through the endless glories of jewelry through the centuries. Each session consists of two hours of dazzling color slides, accompanied by a lecture placing each beautiful item in the historical, social and political context of its day.

July 12 "Introduction: The Language of Jewelry." A swift introductory *tour d'horizon* of jewelry through the ages which explores the way in which jewelry conveys messages about the wearer, such as "I'm powerful," "I'm loved," "I'm holy," "I'm safe from evil," or "I'm rich." Each of these themes is illustrated by slides of jewelry from ancient times to the present day.

July 19 "The Ancients: The Egyptians, Scythians, Etruscans, Greeks & Romans." Begins in Egypt (2nd millennium B.C.) and continues by tracing the splendors of ancient Mediterranean jewelry over the next 2,500 years.

July 26 "Barbarian Europe and Byzantium: A Turbulent Millennium." Explores the vigorous, beautiful jewelry made in the new barbarian kingdoms that succeeded the power of the Western Roman Empire as Rome gradually morphed into the earliest beginnings of modern Europe.

Course 5S02A Making Sense of God (4 Sessions)

We have identified a new dynamic speaker, who is a doctor of philosophy, to enhance our courses on religion, especially since we have lost two others.

This course provides a philosophical view of God for people of any faith. It explores modern and post-modern paradigms of knowledge, truth and certainty toward a greater understanding of our talk about God. Issues to be addressed include the relationship between modernity and post-modernity and the function of religious language; the question of what it means to speak of God; what it is to claim one is worshiping the same God; is God real, and if so, what does it mean to make that claim. This course will be of particular interest to those with questions concerning what it means to know God.
