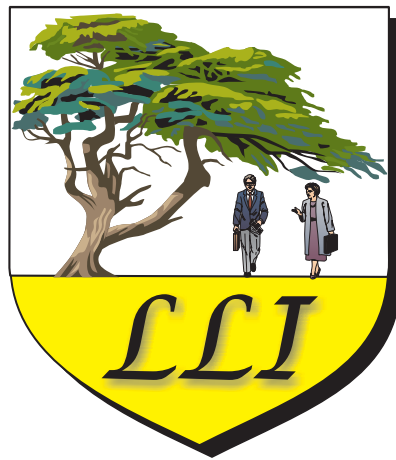

General Information

What Is LLI?

Sponsored by Northern Virginia Community College (NVCC), Lifetime Learning Institute of Northern Virginia (LLI/NOVA) is a non-profit, member-run organization dedicated to providing continuing educational opportunities to older adults of all backgrounds and income levels. LLI/NOVA is a member of the Elderhostel Institute Network (EIN) and benefits from the services EIN provides in program development.

LLI membership is especially attractive to individuals 50 years old or older (retired or semi-retired), who are interested in pursuing intellectual enrichment and enjoying social interaction with their peers.

LLI

- is governed and financed by members
- is supported by member-led planning, administration, and instruction
- provides non-credit, non-degree courses
- offers educational, cultural, and social events
- recognizes physical and mental health are major elements of vital aging.

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How Are the Courses Organized?

Courses generally consist of one to ten 90-minute sessions, are informal, and frequently include group discussion. They are taught by outside faculty and by your fellow LLI members. Most courses are free to members, but some include assigned reading and purchase of a textbook, or require a small materials fee.

When Are the Classes and Where?

Classes are offered throughout the year, subdivided into Winter/Spring, Summer, and Fall semesters. They are typically held on weekdays between the hours of 10 a.m. and 3 p.m. The courses are held on the NVCC Annandale campus and off-campus in churches, community centers and other suitable locations.

Benefits of Membership

- Participation in courses and special interest groups throughout the year usually without charge.
- Participation in day and overnight trips at the special membership rate.
- Participation in the group overseas Study/Travel program.
- Attendance at social events such as the annual picnic and winter holiday luncheon.
- Monthly newsletter.
- And hopefully, new friendships.

How Do I Become a Member and What Is the Cost?

Complete the membership application form found on pages 25 and 27, and mail with your check to the address shown. The current annual membership fee is \$110. The membership period is for 12 months beginning with the month in which dues are paid.

How Do I Register for Classes and Tours?

Complete a class registration form found on pages 21 and 23, listing the courses you wish to attend *in order of preference*. Mail to the LLI office with a self-addressed stamped envelope and any applicable fees as soon as possible; *registration for classes closes June 5, 2007*. Registration forms received after that date will be considered only if there are spaces remaining in the courses you select. Your registration form will be mailed back to you in your self-addressed envelope shortly after the closing date, but in advance of the first class, indicating whether you have been accepted, wait-listed, or whether the class has been canceled. As a courtesy to other LLI members, please call the Leader/Coordinator listed in the specific course description if you will not be able to attend part or all of a course after you have been accepted. This will give members on a waiting list an opportunity to attend.

Registration for trips should be submitted on the separate forms provided. Please remember to sign the "Assumption of Risk and Acknowledgment of Responsibility" statement.

LLI courses are open only to those LLI members who have **registered and been accepted** into the course unless otherwise specified. **Please note** that if you are wait-listed for a course, you are not "accepted" unless notified and must register for that course the next time it is offered; you will be given priority when you re-register.

Monthly Forums

Members and non-members are warmly welcomed as guests to attend the Speakers Program and Open House Forum. The Forum is held monthly (except during the summer) at 10:00 a.m. in the Richard J. Ernst Community Cultural Center (see map on page 5) on the NVCC Annandale Campus (see page 7 for schedule).

Persons attending these Forums should park in the garage on Center Drive next to the Ernst Center. There is a \$1.00 per hour charge to park in the garage.

Class Cancellations

If there is inclement weather, LLI classes and other activities, including FORUMS, are canceled (**except for bus tours**) if the Fairfax County school system cancels school for the day, *regardless of the LLI class location and whether or not NVCC holds its regular college classes*. Listen for radio and TV announcements. LLI morning classes are canceled if the County announces a 2-hour delay in class openings. LLI afternoon classes are canceled if the County announces early dismissal. You will be notified of a schedule for

"make-up" classes. Under special circumstances, if a class is not going to be cancelled, registered participants will be notified by the course coordinator. For bus tours, please contact the tour leader (listed in the program booklet).

Directions to Class Locations — Summer 2007

Franconia Government Center, 6121 Franconia Road, Springfield

Directions from I 95, 395 & 495 (from the west)

Exit onto Franconia-Springfield Exit heading east on Franconia Road. Center is on your right after you pass Forest Lane.

Directions from 495 (from the east)

Exit at Van Dorn South. Turn right on Franconia Road. Center is on the left just after you cross Beulah Street.

Greenspring Village, 7440 Spring Village Drive, Springfield

Directions from Annandale

At the intersection of Little River Turnpike and Backlick Road, go south on Backlick Road. Follow Backlick Road for approximately four miles to the sign for Franconia-Springfield Parkway (Route 7900). Take the first right onto the Parkway, going west. At the first traffic light, turn right onto Spring Village Drive.

Directions from Braddock Road

From Kings Park Shopping Center, drive south on Rolling Road for four miles to the Franconia-Springfield Parkway (Route 7900). Exit left at the second traffic light for the Parkway south. Continue one mile; turn left at the traffic light onto Spring Village Drive.

IMPORTANT: At the guard gate, inform the attendant that you are attending a Lifetime Learning Institute class at Hunters Crossing, Village Square, or Town Center.

James Lee Community Center, 2855 Annandale Road, Falls Church

Directions from the Beltway

Take Arlington Blvd. (Rte. 50) towards Falls Church to Annandale Road. Turn left on Annandale Road (going towards the center of Falls Church) to a traffic light at James Lee Street. Turn right into the parking lot. Please enter the building on the parking lot side and take an immediate right to the classrooms.

John Marshall Library, Rose Hill Drive, Alexandria

Directions from I 95, 395 & 495 (from the west)

Exit onto Franconia-Springfield Exit heading east on Franconia Road. Turn right on Rose Hill Drive which is two traffic lights past Van Dorn Street. The library is on the left just beyond the Rose Hill Shopping Center.

Directions from 495 (from the east)

Exit at Van Dorn South. Turn right on Franconia Road. Turn left on Rose Hill Drive which is two

traffic lights passed Van Dorn Street . The library is on the left just beyond the Rose Hill Shopping Center.

Little River United Church of Christ, 8410 Little River Turnpike, Annandale

Directions from the Beltway

West on Little River Turnpike (Route 236) to the second traffic light (you will see the NVCC campus on the left). Turn right at the light and follow the road to the church parking lot.

Directions from Wakefield Chapel Road

Turn right onto Little River Turnpike (Route 236) and get into the left lane. Turn left at the first traffic light and follow the road to the church parking lot.

Mason District Governmental Center, 6507 Columbia Pike, Annandale

Directions from the Beltway

East on Little River Turnpike (Route 236). Turn left onto John Marr Drive (next light after passing Giant Food on the left). Turn right at the next light, which is Columbia Pike. Go through several traffic lights. Following the traffic light at the intersection with Whispering Lane, there is a sign in the median reading "Fairfax County Police Station." Proceed a short distance and turn right into the parking lot of the Center.

Meadowlark Botanical Gardens, Beulah Road, Vienna

Directions from the Beltway (Route 495)

Proceeding on the Beltway toward Baltimore (and the American Legion Bridge), exit onto Route 123 South (Dolley Madison Blvd.), proceed through two traffic signals (past Tysons Corner Center on your left and Tysons II on your right) to the intersection with Gallows Road (the third traffic signal). Turn right onto Gallows Road, moving immediately into the **left** turn lane. The next intersection is with Old Courthouse Road (and another traffic signal). Turn left onto Old Courthouse Road and proceed until it intersects with Beulah Road on your left. Proceed **straight** through this intersection (you may notice that the road's name changed from Old Courthouse to Beulah even though you kept straight...only in Virginia!). Proceed on Beulah Road until you reach Meadowlark Gardens (and Meadowlark Gardens Court) on your left. Turn into the Court and you will find parking on your left.

National Gallery of Art, 6th and Constitution Ave., N. W., Washington, D. C.

Closest Metro station is Archives/Navy Memorial (on the green and yellow lines).

Ernst Community Cultural Center (CE), also called the NVCC Cultural Center, Annandale Campus, building marked "1" on the map. The Forum is the large open space (with fireplace) on

the mezzanine level. Seminar rooms are on the mezzanine level adjacent to the Forum. The Dance Room is located on the first floor behind the elevator.

Parkwood Baptist Church, 8726 Braddock Road, Annandale

From the Beltway

Go West on Braddock Road. Approximately $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile past Wakefield Chapel Road, the Church is on your right just before Woodland Way and Kings Park Shopping Center.

From NVCC

Go down Wakefield Chapel road and turn right onto Braddock Road. Drive approximately $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile. The Church is on your right just before Woodland Way and Kings Park Shopping Center.

Providence Presbyterian Church, 9019 Little River Turnpike, Fairfax

Directions from the Beltway

Drive west on Little River Turnpike. Cross Wakefield Chapel Road and Guinea Road. Church is on the left a short distance after Guinea Road. Turn into church and go all the way to the rear to park. Enter the large double doors and immediately turn right. Go through the inside double doors and you will be in the classroom.

Directions from Fairfax

Drive east on Little River Turnpike. Cross Olley Lane and go through light at Prince William Drive. Church is on the right a short distance after Prince William Drive. Turn into church and go all the way to the rear to park. Enter the large double doors and immediately turn right. Go through the inside double doors and you will be in the classroom.

St. Matthew's United Methodist Church, 8617 Little River Turnpike, Annandale

Directions from the Beltway

West on Little River Turnpike (Route 236). Pass the NVCC campus and Wakefield Chapel Road (second and third traffic lights). Take the next left (which does not have a traffic light) onto Wakefield Drive; immediately turn right and then left into the church parking lot. Park in spaces near the left-hand side of the church since you will be entering the building through a basement door on the left side.

Directions from Braddock Road going East

Turn left onto Wakefield Chapel Road. Continue for approximately 1.3 miles (passing NVCC on the right) and turn left onto Virginia Avenue. At the stop sign turn right onto Wakefield Drive and then turn left into the church parking lot.

The Virginian, 9229 Arlington Boulevard (Route 50), Fairfax

Directions from the Beltway and Little River Turnpike (Route 236)

Drive west on Little River Turnpike to Pickett Road. Turn right on Pickett Road and drive to Arlington Boulevard. Turn right onto Arlington Boulevard and then turn right at the first traffic light which will take you into The Virginian's driveway. Follow signs for visitor parking.

*Directions from the Beltway and Arlington Boulevard
(Route 50)*

Drive west on Arlington Boulevard. Turn left at the first traffic light** after Nutley Street into The Virginian's driveway. Follow signs for visitor parking.

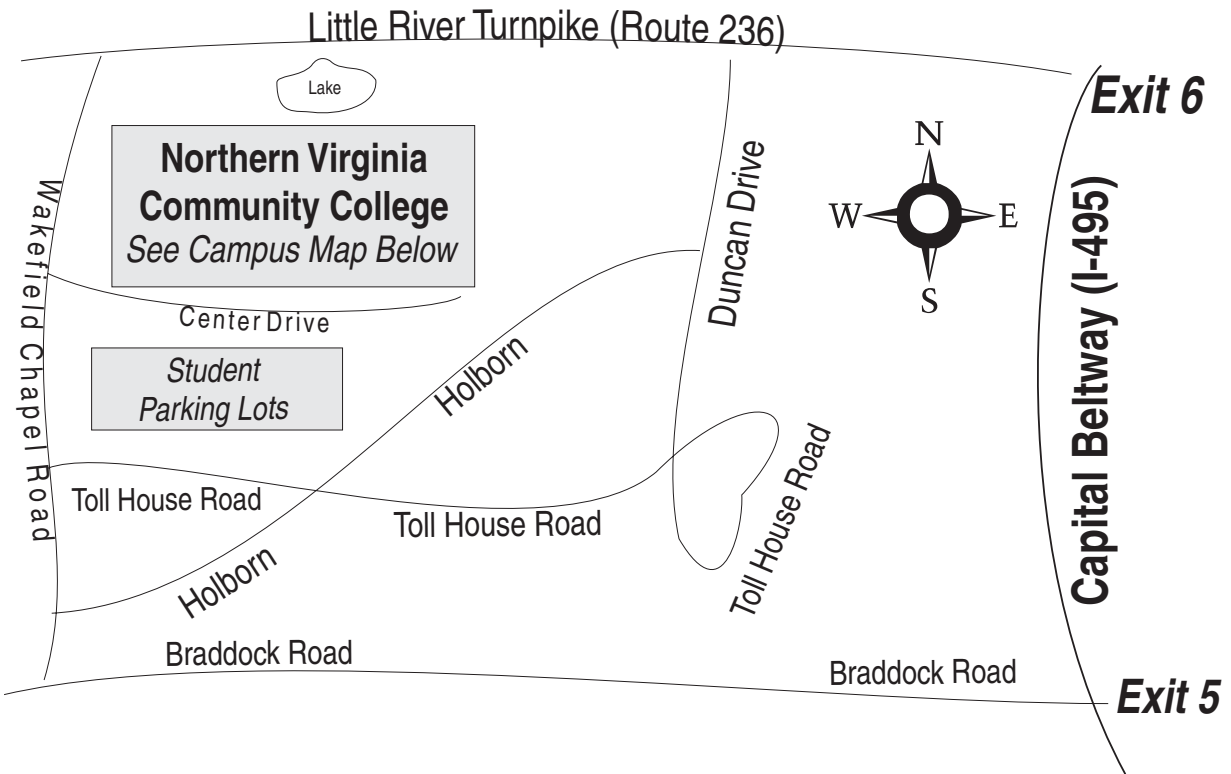
** Landmark at this traffic light: Stonehurst Drive is on the right. Be sure to take a left at the traffic light into The Virginian complex.

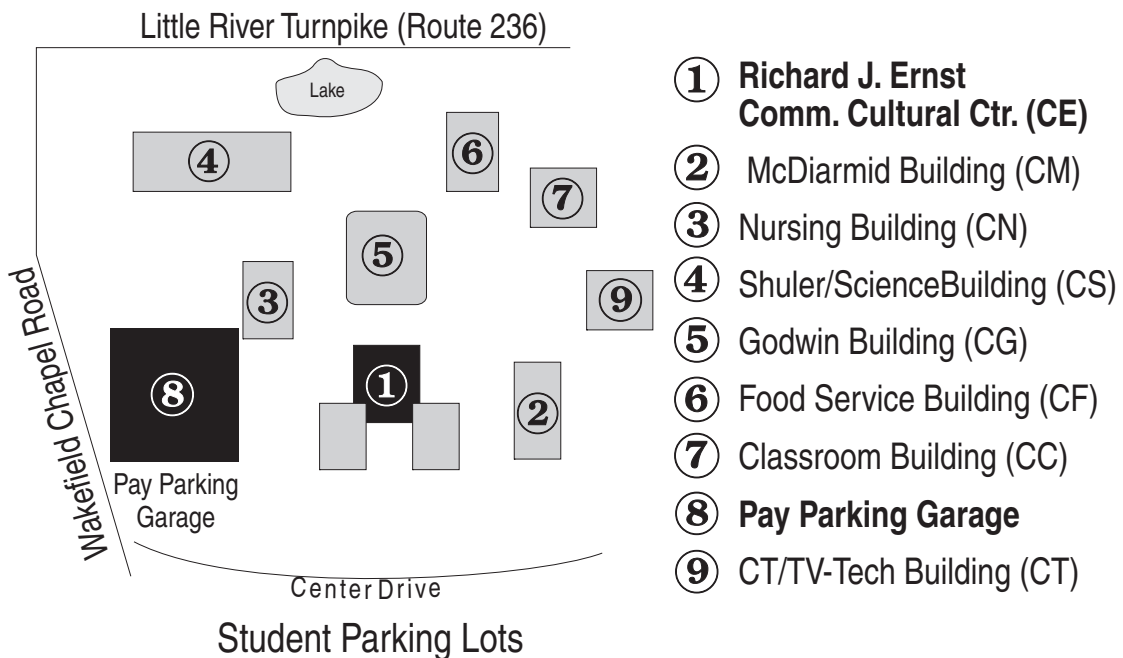
Directions from the Beltway (Route 495)

Course 7S02P Introduction to the National Parks (4 Sessions)

"Though small in number, their influence is large."
Written in 1929 by the first National Park Service

Director, these words resonate among National Park Rangers who recognize and appreciate the power and responsibility underlying them. Few greater pleasures exist beyond experiencing the United States through its National Parks—homes for many of our country's cultural, natural, and recreational resources. Our Greater Washington National Parks system, for example, preserves more than 131,000 acres of park and forested lands with 717 miles of trails, 250 miles of riverfront, 152 statues, and 3000-plus historic structures. Beyond this local bounty, the National Park Service boasts nearly 400 additional units where one truly can experience America. While nothing replaces visits to these parks, veteran Park Rangers remain fair substitutes. We invite you to experience eight of our National Parks through the stories, recollections, and insights of eight current Washington, DC, Park Rangers who once served in other parts of our America.

Course 7S04A Alternate Transportation Options for Seniors (1 Session)

There are presently several transportation resources that exist for the senior population of Fairfax County, all of which alleviate the need to use one's personal vehicle. In this class, several specific programs and

services will be presented, including Seniors On-The-Go, Travel Training, FASTRAN, and the FAIRFAX CONNECTOR. On a more regional scale, information on WMATA (Washington Metropolitan Area and Transit Authority) bus and rail, DASH (Alexandria City), ART (Arlington County), CUE (Fairfax City) and Metro Access (the disability branch of WMATA) will also be presented. Finally, information on how seniors may take advantage of reduced fares on the local fixed route, a new taxicab program for disabled users of Metro Access, and the County's Pedestrian Safety Program will also be explained. Three staff persons from the Fairfax County Department of Transportation will present this program.

Course 7S06A Wildlife Photography (2 Sessions)

There is extraordinary beauty and adventure on the street where you live! Dan Dennison, a Northern Virginia photographer, will introduce LLI members to the excitement of photographing birds flying in their own yards. Using a digital single-lens reflex (SLR) camera and a 300-millimeter lens, Dan has photographed 30 species of birds and several other animals in his own neighborhood. Some digital cameras can take many fast (1/2000th of a second) photos in a short period of time. These features improve a photographer's prospects for photographing moving animals. With an SLR camera, a photographer can also capture the bright colors of Northern Cardinals and Red-Bellied Woodpeckers, the dexterity of Carolina Chickadees and the aerial ballet of the Ruby-Throated Hummingbirds. Dan will share with us how to attract songbirds with plants and habitat preferred by the Goldfinch, Song Sparrow and Catbird. He will also discuss the camera equipment and techniques needed to photograph birds in-flight, running on the ground under the azaleas or perched on a distant tree limb, along with some suggested props to capture the antics of inquisitive squirrels. Following each session, the

group will go to Green Spring Gardens on Braddock Road for a tour.

Specific topics include: U.S. energy policy in the context of our absolute dependence on energy as the basis of civilization, arrayed against the severe societal costs associated with energy use, including climate change; military and geopolitical costs; economic impacts of oil shocks; environmental pollution; and ethical and philosophical issues that appear to be barriers to U.S. action on climate change.

Course 7S18A Summer Art at the Movies: The National Gallery of Art (3 Sessions)

These sessions will focus on Realism, Impressionism, and Post-Impressionism.

July 12 *Awareness Series: Modern Masters.* This film includes short, evocative studies of works by seven major artists represented in the collections of the National Gallery of Art, including Monet, Renoir, Degas, Cassatt, Gauguin, Cezanne, and Picasso. *Art Nouveau.* Art Nouveau was one of the most innovative and exuberant of the modern art movements. This film explores the development of Art Nouveau in Europe and North America, focusing on individual works of art and architectural landmarks. Interviews with scholars and rare archival footage of the period are included.

July 19 *Paul Gauguin: The Savage Dream.* Filmed on location in Tahiti and the Marquesas Islands, this film explores Gauguin's obsessive search for an alternative to his own culture, culminating with his artistic achievements in the South Pacific. To a great extent, the story is told in Gauguin's words, revealing his personal philosophy of art and life. *Important Information Inside: John F. Peto and the Idea of Still-Life Painting.* This film explores Peto's art in the context of his native Philadelphia and the Pennsylvania Academy of the Fine Arts, where he trained. Live footage shows the artist's home and studio in Island Heights, NJ, which reveal the artist's temperament in

their design and in his collections of objects—the very forms found in his paintings. A survey of the development of still-life painting in American art is also included.

July 26 *An American Impressionist: William Merritt Chase at Shinnecock.* This film highlights Chase's years at Shinnecock on Long Island, NY, where in 1891 he established the first important outdoor summer school of art in America. Chase's paintings and archival photographs—many of the artist's studios—are interwoven with footage of the hills and beaches at Shinnecock and of Chase's house and studio as they are today. *James McNeill Whistler: The Lyrics of Art.* Painter and printmaker James McNeill Whistler was one of the most controversial and fascinating personalities of the 19th century. This film follows his life and career in America, London, Paris and Venice. From his early realist paintings to his nearly abstract Nocturnes, Whistler's aesthetic innovations were precursors of trends in 20th century art. *James McNeill Whistler: His Etchings.* Whistler worked extensively with the etching technique. This film shows the changes in Whistler's art and style over the years, focusing on the effects he achieved by experimenting with inking and printing techniques.
