## How Are the Courses Organized?

Courses generally consist of one to ten 90-minute sessions, are informal, and frequently include group discussion. They are taught by outside faculty and by your fellow LLI members. Most courses are free to members, but some include assigned reading and purchase of a textbook, or require a small materials fee.

## When Are the Classes and Where?

Classes are offered throughout the year, subdivided into Winter/Spring, Summer, and Fall semesters. They are typically held on weekdays between the hours of 10 a.m. and 3 p.m. The courses are held on the NVCC Annandale campus and off-campus in churches, community centers and other suitable locations.

## How Do I Become a Member and What Is the Cost?

Complete the membership application form found on pages 21 and 23 and mail with your check to the address shown. The current annual membership fee is \$110. The membership period is for 12 months beginning with the month in which dues are paid.

## How Do I Register for Classes and Tours?

Complete a class registration form found on pages 17 and 19, listing the courses you wish to attend *in order of preference*. Mail to the LLI office with a self-addressed stamped envelope and any applicable fees as soon as possible; *registration for classes closes June 2, 2008*. Registration forms received after that date will be considered only if there are spaces remaining in the courses you select. Your registration form will be mailed back to you in your self-addressed envelope shortly after the closing date, but in advance of the first class, indicating whether you have been accepted, wait-listed, or whether the class has been canceled. As a courtesy to other LLI members, please call the Leader/Coordinator listed in the specific course description if you will not be able to attend part or all of a course after you have been accepted. This will give members on a waiting list an opportunity to attend.

Registration for trips should be submitted on the separate forms provided. Please remember to sign the "Assumption of Risk and Acknowledgment of Responsibility" statement.

LLI courses are open only to those LLI members who have **registered and been accepted** into the course unless otherwise specified. **Please note** that if you are wait-listed for a course, you are not "accepted" unless notified and must register for that course the next time it is offered; you will be given priority when you re-register.

## Monthly Forums

Members and non-members are warmly welcomed as guests to attend the Speakers Program and Open House Forum. The Forum is held monthly (except during the summer) at 10:00 a.m. in the Richard J. Ernst Community Cultural Center (see map on page 4) on the NVCC Annandale Campus (see page 5 for schedule).

Persons attending these Forums should park in the garage on Center Drive next to the Ernst Center. There is a \$1.00 per hour charge to park in the garage.

## Class Cancellations

If there is inclement weather, LLI classes and other activities, including FORUMS, are canceled (**except for bus tours**) if the Fairfax County school system cancels school for the day, *regardless of the LLI class location and whether or not NVCC holds its regular college classes*. Listen for radio and TV announcements. LLI morning classes are canceled if the County announces a 2-hour delay in class openings. LLI afternoon classes are canceled if the County announces early dismissal. You will be notified of a schedule for

"make-up" classes. Under special circumstances, if a class is not going to be cancelled, registered participants will be notified by the course coordinator. For bus tours, please contact the tour leader (listed in the program booklet).

## Directions to Class Locations — Summer 2008

**Fairfax Museum and Visitor Center**, 10209 Main St., Fairfax

From the NVCC Annandale campus, proceed west on Little River Turnpike (Route 236), which changes name to Main Street in Fairfax City. The Museum is located on Main St. between the intersections with Locust Ave. and East St./Old Lee Hwy. next door to Gold's Gym and across the street from the new Main Street Market Place (Harris Teeter, TJ Maxx, etc.)

**Little River United Church of Christ**, 8410 Little River Turnpike, Annandale

### *Directions from the Beltway*

West on Little River Turnpike (Route 236) to the second traffic light (you will see the NVCC campus on the left). Turn right at the light and follow the road to the church parking lot.

### *Directions from Wakefield Chapel Road*

Turn right onto Little River Turnpike (Route 236) and get into the left lane. Turn left at the first traffic light and follow the road to the church parking lot.

**Mason District Governmental Center**, 6507 Columbia Pike, Annandale

### *Directions from the Beltway*

East on Little River Turnpike (Route 236). Turn left onto John Marr Drive (next light after passing Giant Food on the left). Turn right at the next light, which is Columbia Pike. Go through several traffic lights. Following the traffic light at the intersection with Whispering Lane, there is a sign in the median reading "Fairfax County Police Station." Proceed a short distance and turn right into the parking lot of the Center.

**Meadowlark Botanical Gardens**, Beulah Road, Vienna

### *Directions from the Beltway (Route 495)*

Proceeding on the Beltway toward Baltimore (and the American Legion Bridge), exit onto Route 123 South (Dolley Madison Blvd.), and proceed through two traffic signals (past Tysons Corner Center on your left and Tysons II on your right) to the intersection with Gallows Road (the third traffic signal). Turn right onto Gallows Road, moving immediately into the **left** turn lane. The next intersection is with Old Courthouse Road (and another traffic signal). Turn left onto Old Courthouse Road and proceed until it intersects with Beulah Road on your left. Proceed **straight** through this intersection (you may notice that the road's name changed from Old Courthouse to Beulah even though you kept straight...only in Virginia!). Proceed on Beulah Road until you reach Meadowlark Gardens (and Meadowlark Gardens

Court) on your left. Turn into the Court and you will find parking on your left.

**National Gallery of Art**, 6th and Constitution Ave., N. W., Washington, D. C.

Closest Metro station is Archives/Navy Memorial (on the green and yellow lines).

**National Park Service Survey Lodge/Ranger Station**, between 15th & 17th Streets on Independence Avenue

From the Blue/Orange Metro Line, get off at the Smithsonian Station on Independence Avenue and follow Independence down just past 15th Street. If driving, parking may be available at the Paddle Boats parking area along eastbound Independence Avenue on the Tidal Basin.

**NVCC Campus Buildings**

(Refer to campus map on p. 4.)

Parking for all Campus Classes and Activities. **PLEASE PARK IN THE PAY PARKING GARAGE NEXT TO THE CULTURAL CENTER. THERE IS A \$1.00 PER HOUR CHARGE TO PARK IN THE GARAGE.**

**Ernst Community Cultural Center (CE)**, also called the NVCC Cultural Center, Annandale Campus, building marked "1" on the map. The Forum is the large open space (with fireplace) on the mezzanine level. Seminar rooms are on the mezzanine level adjacent to the Forum. The Dance Room is located on the first floor behind the elevator.

**Spring Hill Club House**, Lorton, VA

From 395 South onto 95 South, take Exit 163 for Lorton and turn right on Lorton Road. At the very next traffic light, turn right on Silverbrook Rd. Continue on Silverbrook to the next traffic light and turn left on Laurel Crest Drive; turn left on Mountain Larkspur Drive (about 500 feet). At this point, there is a gate with a keypad that you must use to enter. The access code will be provided by the instructor prior to the class. At the second street, turn right and the Club House is just past the stop sign.

From the Fairfax County Parkway (7100), take the Hooes Road exit and go south. After approximately 1.3 miles, turn left at the second traffic light on Silverbrook Road. Continue on

Silverbrook to the next traffic light and turn left on Laurel Crest Drive; turn left on Mountain Larkspur Drive (about 500 feet). At this point, there is a gate with a keypad that you must use to enter. The access code will be provided by the instructor prior to the class. At the second street, turn right and the Club House is just past the stop sign.

**St. Matthew's United Methodist Church**, 8617 Little River Turnpike, Annandale

*Directions from the Beltway*

West on Little River Turnpike (Route 236). Pass the NVCC campus and Wakefield Chapel Road (second and third traffic lights). Take the next left (which does not have a traffic light) onto Wakefield Drive; immediately turn right and then left into the church parking lot. Park in spaces near the left-hand side of the church since you will be entering the building through a basement door on the left side.

*Directions from Braddock Road going East*

Turn left onto Wakefield Chapel Road. Continue for approximately 1.3 miles (passing NVCC on the right) and turn left onto Virginia Avenue. At the stop sign turn right onto Wakefield Drive and then turn left into the church parking lot.

**The Virginian**, 9229 Arlington Boulevard (Route 50), Fairfax

*Directions from the Beltway and Little River Turnpike (Route 236)*

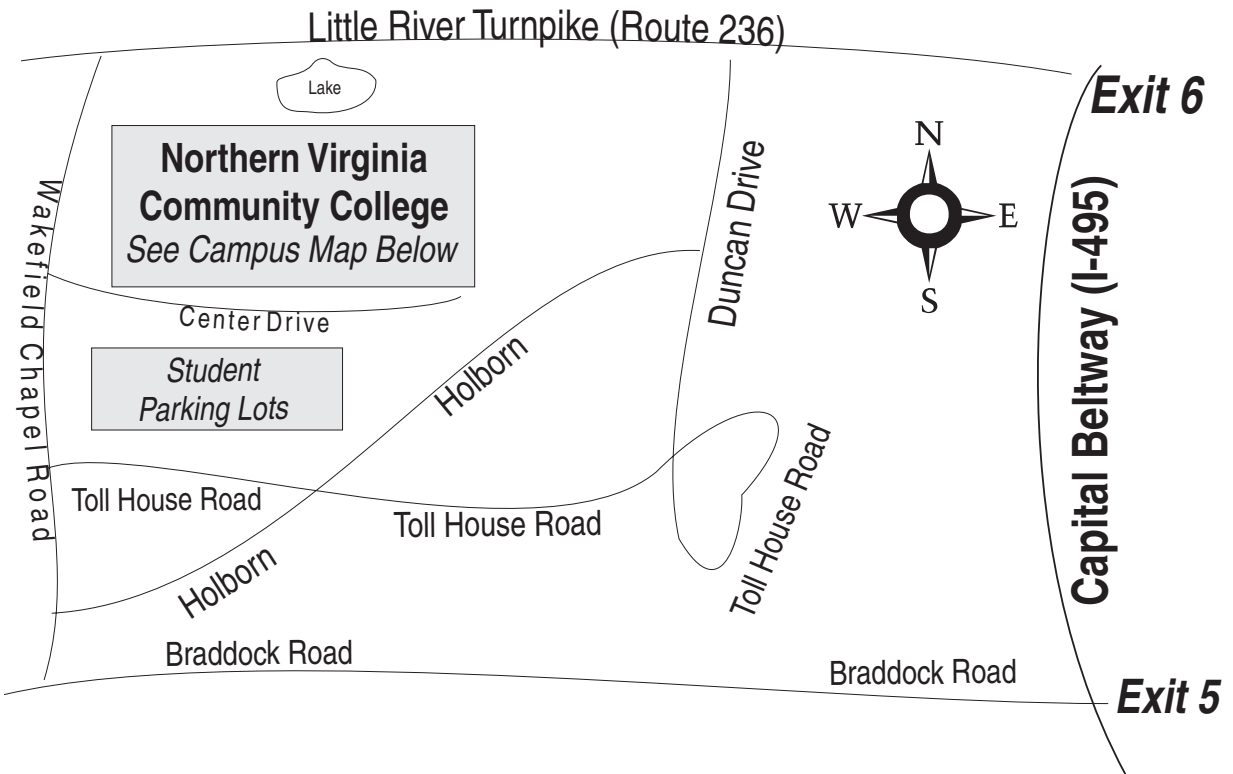
Drive west on Little River Turnpike to Pickett Road. Turn right on Pickett Road and drive to Arlington Boulevard. Turn right onto Arlington Boulevard and then turn right at the first traffic light which will take you into The Virginian's driveway. Follow signs for visitor parking.

*Directions from the Beltway and Arlington Boulevard (Route 50)*

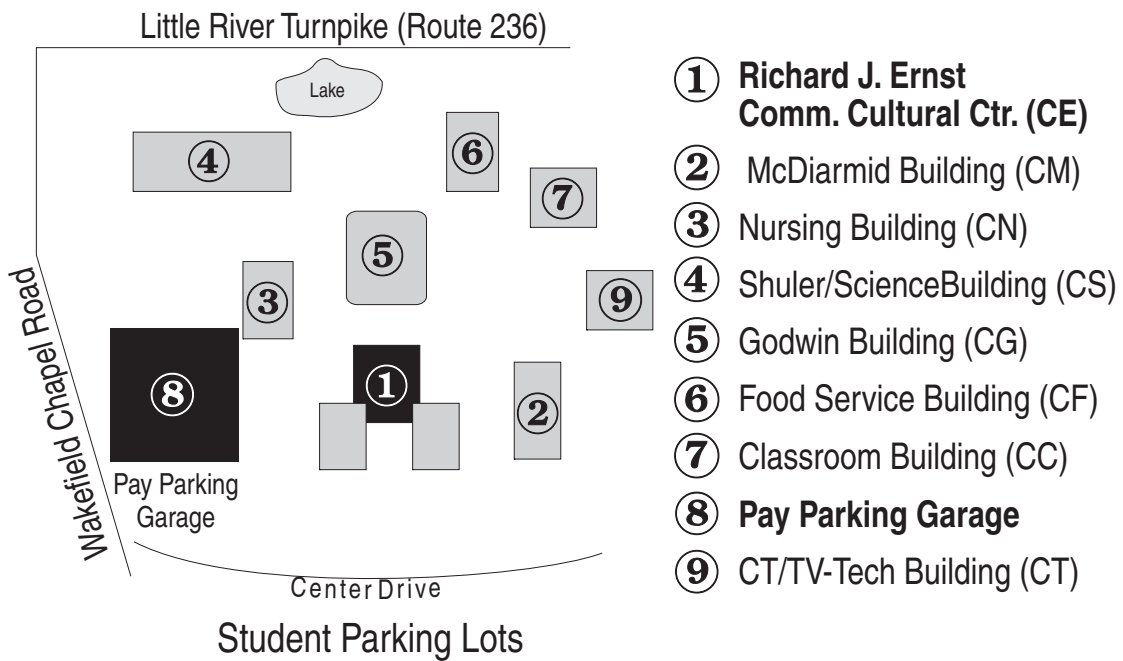
Drive west on Arlington Boulevard. Turn left at the first traffic light\*\* after Nutley Street into The Virginian's driveway. Follow signs for visitor parking.

\*\* Landmark at this traffic light: Stonehurst Drive is on the right. Be sure to take a left at the traffic light into The Virginian complex.

### Course 8S01A Golf, Gettysburg, and Grandchildren: Protecting the Eisenhowers (1 Session)

A Special Agent with the U.S. Secret Service recalled Dwight D. Eisenhower's presidential terms simply as: protecting "the three G's"—golf, Gettysburg, and grandchildren. What special role has the Secret Service played in American history and what kind of a job is it to protect the most powerful man in the world and his family? ### Course 8S02A The War of 1812 (4 Sessions)

Born of the Napoleonic Wars and begun in ignorance, the War of 1812 exposed deep divisions within the United States, uncovered tears in the fabric of the Union, and opened another opportunity for Great Britain to conquer her former colonies. Derisively dubbed "Mr. Madison's War" by some, the conflict included disastrous American defeats, frustrating stalemates, the near secession of New England, and the humiliation stemming from the British capture and torching of Washington, D.C. In spite of a foreign invasion on three frontiers and military setbacks, this American "Second War for Independence" produced great heroes, impressive naval victories on the lakes and seas, the triumph at New Orleans, and an unforgettable, stirring national anthem. We will explore how the War of 1812 ultimately transformed the United States into a rising power on the world stage.

### Course 8S03A The Hidden Truth: A National Icon Revealed (1 Session)

The Lincoln Memorial endures as an icon to which millions of visitors make an annual pilgrimage. However, do you know what lies beneath the statue of Abraham Lincoln or what lies behind the innumerable myths and legends about it? Have you ever pondered the meanings of the thirty-six exterior columns or stopped to study the intricate details carved into marble and limestone? This course will debunk myths and delve into the deep symbolism contained within each carving, while developing the story of how the Lincoln Memorial Commission rose above raging battles over competing architectural schemes and suitable locations to create the most visited memorial in the nation's capital. Join National Park Ranger Jason Martz as he takes you on a figurative journey to hidden treasures and secrets that only a Washington insider could know.

**Course 8S04A World War I & II Memorials Tour: The “War to End All Wars” and “The Greatest Generation Revisited” (1 Session)**

On November 11, 1931, President Herbert C. Hoover dedicated the D.C. World War Memorial as a tribute to Washington’s World War One veterans, but, as he spoke, the seeds of a second, more devastating global war had begun to grow from soils already enriched with the blood of American patriots. Within a generation, Great War veterans were forced to see their sons go off to fight in another world war and to realize that President Wilson’s “War to End All Wars” declaration did not prove true. On May 29, 2004, President George W. Bush dedicated the World War II Memorial in the midst of another war begun by others in the wake of the Cold War. Experience the World War I and World War II memorials — respectively, the National Mall’s oldest and newest veterans’ memorials—as you never have before. Learn the insider secrets and see these sites from the perspectives of the subject matter experts — National Mall Park Rangers.

**Course 8S11A Dutch Masters: The Age of Rembrandt (4 Sessions)**

This is a continuation of our Winter/Spring program on Dutch Masters. During these four sessions, we will watch eight videotaped lectures given by Professor William Kloss, Independent Art Historian, The Smithsonian Associates, Smithsonian Institution, and published by The Teaching Company. These lectures will focus on Rembrandt. The lecture titles are as follows: (1) The Decoration of the Amsterdam Town Hall; Rembrandt to 1630; (2) Rembrandt in Amsterdam, 1631-34; Rembrandt and the Baroque Style; (3) Rembrandt's Personal Baroque Style; Rembrandt's Etchings; and (4) Rembrandt in the 1650s; Rembrandt's Last Years.
