History

- Christopher Columbus first arrived to La Hispaniola on December 6th 1492.
- Eventually indigenous population significantly decreased due to deceases they did not had protection for, brought by the colonizers.
- African slaves were introduced to the island to do hard work.
- The island was desired by colonizers because of the gold they found.
- Spain and France came to agreements to take sides of the island for each other.

Island past division

- Island structure at the arrival of colonizers.
- Called Ayiti ("land of high mountains").
- Once Christopher Columbus arrived, he used the name "La hispaniola".





- 31 provinces and 1 national district.
- Provinces are divided into municipalities, then neighborhoods.

Size Comparison



Dominican Republic is about 202 times smaller than **United States**. **United States** is approximately 9,833,517 sq km, while **Dominican Republic** is approximately 48,670 sq km, making **Dominican Republic** 0.49% the **size** of **United States**.

- The official spoken language is Spanish in the whole country.
- Official religion is Catholicism, other popular one is Protestant or Evangelical.

Meat or chicken, some groceries and banana leaves.




Common lunch called "Sancocho".
