A field guide to Honduran Birds with a brief discussion of the layout of the land. Honduras hosts an odd landscape with mostly mountains. It sits near the junction of three tectonic plates that are constantly moving but the country has no volcanoes. This book provides the first reference to the Honduran Depression that I have ever seen.
