President's Message

I hope that you have been able to attend one or more of our recent monthly forums. Although all forums and classes have been conducted remotely since the onset of the pandemic, they have been offered by high-caliber presenters and have been extremely informative.

In April, David K. Owens, President/Energy Consultant with Da' Vision and Strategies, discussed power grid issues in Puerto Rico caused by Hurricane Maria in 2017 and by the winter storm in Texas earlier this year. In May, Karla Bruce, Chief Equity Officer for Fairfax County, described how Fairfax is trying to offer services equitably through its One Fairfax Policy. And in June, Daniel Piazza, Curator of Philately at the U.S. Postal Museum, told attendees about "Stories Behind the Stamps," his museum's collection and how exhibits are put together while providing little-known history of Washington and its architecture.

Our next forum will be September 1 when Dr. Madhavi Colton of the Coral Reef Alliance will present.

We are expanding our Forum Committee and plan to return to live forums as soon as possible. If you have ideas regarding future forum topics/presenters, or would like to join the committee, contact the Forum Committee Chair, Patti Volz.

Did you know that LLI/NOVA members provided \$25,000 of scholarship assistance to students at Northern Virginia Community College last year? The LLI Scholarship Program helps high-achieving, low-income students at the Annandale campus.

An April 2, 2021, New York Times article reported the following: "Colleges of all types are struggling under the shadow of the coronavirus, but the nation's community college system has been disproportionately hurt, with tens of thousands of students being forced to delay school or drop out because of the pandemic and the

economic crisis it has created."

"Enrollment is down 9.5 percent at the more than 1,000 two-year colleges in the United States compared with numbers from last spring, according to the National Student Clearinghouse, a nonprofit organization that found a similar drop last fall. That is more than double the loss experienced by four-year schools.

"Community college enrollment among Black and Hispanic students has declined even more sharply, with a 19 percent drop from fall 2019 to fall 2020 among Black students and a 16 percent drop among Hispanic students. Of the nation's five million students enrolled at community colleges, about 40 percent are Black or Latino and nearly half are low-income, according to the American Association of Community Colleges."

LLI/NOVA Scholarship Annual Program

Last year, LLI awarded scholarships of \$5,000 and \$2,500 to several high-performing Northern Virginia Community College (NOVA) students. These scholarships were a lifeline to students in the difficult time of the Covid pandemic. Despite some emergency government funding that was available to NOVA, 280 students applied for our scholarships through the Office of Student Financial Aid. In 2021, LLI will provide additional scholarships for deserving and needy NOVA students. With the emergency government funding coming to an end, many students will experience even more financial stress than last year. The more money we can raise from LLI member contributions, the more students we can help. We encourage LLI's members to contribute to this long running and exceptionally beneficial scholarship program.

- LLI/NOVA members have a unique opportunity to get to know 36 visiting students from 11 developing countries under the U.S. Department of State's CCI) Program, administered by NOVA. The students participate in a fully funded scholarship to spend up to one academic year at a U.S. community college.
- The students hope to strengthen their English language proficiency and to immerse themselves in the culture and day-to-day life of Americans. They plan to participate in community volunteer service projects, thereby enhancing local host communities. They also will serve as leaders on their host campuses and make public presentations as part of International Education Week and other community engagement activities.
- After completing the CCI Program, participants return home with a deeper understanding of U.S. culture
 and new skills; and are expected to contribute to the social and economic development of their home
 countries
- This are several opportunities for LLI/NOVA members to get to know these students on a personal level and to hear about the situations they faced for an opportunity to learn in the United States. Do not miss these chances to engage with these students while their impressions of our culture are fresh. As Mark Twain said: "Travel is fatal to prejudice, bigotry, and narrow-mindedness, and many of our people need it sorely on these accounts. Broad, wholesome, charitable views of men and things cannot be acquired by vegetating in one little corner of the earth all one's lifetime."
