The meeting continued with a brief review of our financial situation and the FY 2023 budget that was approved at our May board meeting. We currently are on sound financial footing, but our expenditures do exceed our income due to reduced membership (Covid). The FY23 budget is projected to have a deficit of about \$3,000, despite several cost-cutting measures. LLI dues will not be raised at this time. although the board will reevaluate the budget in six months. Since our income is almost solely membership-dues-dependent, please reach out to your friends and neighbors and encourage them to join LLI. Also, remember that our website allows any LLI member to "gift" someone an annual membership.

This month's shout-out goes to Board Member Loren Brandman. Loren has served on the LLI Board for several years and will be rotating off on July 1. Loren served in numerous leadership positions with LLI/NOVA, including Treasurer and Nominating Committee Chair, and currently serves as Secretary, Chair of Budget & Finance Committee, and on our Newsletter Committee.
