


# What is Intergenerational Communication?







### Dialogue

A style of communication that respectfully encourages others to want to listen, while also listening in a way that encourages others to want to speak

### Four elements of dialogue



### Civility

The ability to treat the other person with respect so that we can have a lasting, peaceful, and positive interaction



Giving the other person your undivided attention



Accepting others with a positive attitude

### **Mutual equality**

Setting aside power dimensions and communicating in a way that values the contributions made by everyone
