Delegate Vivian Watts: Staying Relevant in the Public Policy Debate



Our speaker will be the Honorable Vivian Watts, who represents the 39th District in the Virginia House of Delegates, which includes part of Fairfax County and the NOVA Annandale campus. She will provide her insights and experiences based on nearly 50 years of serving the people of Fairfax County. She welcomes new, diverse political voices and believes older citizens have an indispensable role to play. Delegate Watts will discuss a wide range of public policy challenges, such as what is taught in schools, nursing home staffing, political polarization, tribalism, greenhouse gases, women's roles, and traffic congestion. Do join us for a rare behind-thescenes look at the challenges of supporting her constituency and the interests of the Commonwealth.

Delegate Watts, a Democrat, is the longest-serving woman in the Virginia

House of Delegates, first being elected in 1981. She is Ranking Minority Member of the Finance and the Courts committees and also serves on Transportation and Rules. She also served as Virginia Secretary of Transportation and Public Safety under Governor Gerald Baliles.

In the House, she has focused on progressive tax policies and increased funding for education, transportation, and mental health services. In 2022, she introduced 82 pieces of legislation that ultimately were enacted.

Before running for office, she had 15 years of active involvement in Fairfax County and was named Fairfax County Citizen of the Year. She has received numerous awards and honors, including Washington Post "Citizen of the Year"; Most Promising House Freshman; Lifetime Achievement Award from the Northern Virginia Transportation Alliance; and in 2020, the Virginia Association of

Counties Achievement Award. Delegate Watts is a graduate of the University of Michigan. She and her husband, David, have been married for 63 years and have two children and four grandchildren.

I'm glad to interject here that I recently participated in a joint interview with OLLI/GMU to provide input to the plan. The interview was conducted by Jacquie Woodruff, Legislative and Policy Supervisor of Fairfax Area Agency on Aging. She has been seeking community input through a series of town halls and focus groups. It was rewarding to learn that LLI/NOVA and OLLI/GMU are recognized for providing invaluable educational, cultural enrichment, and social engagement opportunities to Fairfax County seniors. Your LLI/NOVA Board revisits our Covid-19 Policy on a regular basis, monitoring what other organizations/agencies are doing, and adjusting it to reflect current circumstances, CDC recommendations, and our demographic. LLI maintains its mandatory masking policy for classes and most other events, except when masking is impractical – such as with Foodies and Friends. We continue to highly recommend all event participants be vaccinated and boosted, although class coordinators are not required to check. Our website shows our latest Covid-19 policy (here).

Fairfax Hypothermia Prevention Program helps our most vulnerable residents by ensuring that no Fairfax County resident must sleep outside during the winter months.

FACETS' Fairfax food pantry offers safe places to sleep and nutritious meals for the homeless. It operates in partnership with Fairfax County and religious congregations that host this program for a week, between December 2022 and March 2023.
