About Arch -- "The Accidental Critic"



Arch Campbell is a local legend. He has reported on and critiqued movies, theater, and entertainment events in Washington, D.C., and nationally since the 1970s. His career included 32 years at NBC, as well as eight years with WJLA7 News and News Channel 8. He currently does movie and entertainment reviews as co-host of "At the Movies with Arch and Ann," a weekly podcast with Washington Post lead film critic Ann Hornaday.

Campbell moved to DC from his native Texas in 1974 to join NBC-owned WRC-TV News as a feature reporter. There he created the entertainment beat and hosted twice-daily segments on the local news. NBC syndicated Arch's movie reviews nationally. From 1985-1990, he hosted "The Arch Campbell Show," a late-night comedy forum hit that won more than a dozen Emmy

awards. In 2007, Arch took his movie and theater reviews to ABC-7 News. He created "The Arch Campbell Show" for News Channel 8. The comedy entertainment show grew into the channel's most watched program.

Washingtonian Magazine named him a "Washingtonian of the Year" in 2015 as one of the city's leading arts advocates. He has won eight Emmy awards. In 2016, the National Capitol Radio TV Museum honored him with the Ed Walker Lifetime Achievement Award, named after a Radio Hall of Fame winner in 2009.

Arch supports several Washington, D.C., charities including the Avalon Theatre, Sibley Hospital, and the Greater Washington Community Foundation. Arch is a colon cancer survivor and mentors patients and advocates for colonoscopies. He and his wife, Gina, sponsor the Jean Longwith Scholarship Fund at San Antonio College in his hometown. Arch graduated from the University of Texas with a Bachelor's degree in Radio/TV/Film and a Master's degree in Journalism.


