## Lifelong Learning at NOVA Annandale – A Collaborative Approach



LLI/NOVA is very pleased to welcome Annandale Campus Provost Dr. Diane Mucci as our June Forum speaker. Dr. Mucci will discuss various types of lifelong learning programs at NOVA – degree programs, certificate programs, noncredit courses, and continuing education programs. She will discuss various stakeholders involved in collaborative lifelong learning, such as faculty, staff, students, and community partners, and will highlight some of the benefits of this collaborative approach: increased access to resources and expertise, enhanced program quality, and improved community engagement. She will also share success stories of individuals

who have benefited from lifelong learning approaches and opportunities at NOVA, and will discuss the impact that lifelong learning has on people's lives.

Dr. Mucci has the strong track record of academic and community engagement that is essential to the role of provost. She has served on advisory boards for George Mason University's Science and Technology Campus, George Washington University's Health Sciences programs, and the Osbourn High School Governor's STEM Academy in Manassas.

A highly respected faculty member, Dr. Mucci has dedicated herself to serving and developing as an academic leader focused on equity in student success and advocacy for her colleagues. She has served as Chair of NOVA's College Senate, Chair of the Academic Deans' Council, and discipline coordinator for Biological Sciences. She has completed training to assist ALICE (Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed) student populations and address student trauma; facilitated data equity summits related to STEM disciplines; and participated in the NOVA Student Success Leadership Academy offered in partnership with Achieving the Dream, a Maryland-based organization which champions leaders at community colleges across the country.

We are indeed privileged to welcome Dr. Mucci to our Forum, and we look forward to hearing her perspectives on lifelong learning.

### FY2024 Budget

LLI's bylaws require that the Budget & Finance Committee present the annual



budget to our membership at the annual membership meeting. The LLI Board of Directors approved our fiscal year (FY) 2024 (July 1, 2023 to June 30, 2024) budget at its May 12 meeting. The budget is included in this newsletter (see page 8) and will be reviewed at the annual meeting on June 7.

As we emerge from the uncertainties of the pandemic and look forward to our next fiscal year, the budget supports our continuing events and activities, while retaining our membership dues at the current level of \$110 per year. This conservative budget projects a small net income for the year. The Board reviews our financial position monthly and evaluates spending in accordance with the approved budget. Income and projected spending are reviewed in detail mid-year for any adjustments required.

Since membership dues provide our primary source of income, retaining our members and having new people join are critical to our ability to provide needed income. We currently have 302 members. To provide a conservative estimate going forward, the approved budget is based on a projected membership of 300. Our goal, of course, is to increase our membership to be able to maintain our dues at their current level and still provide the activities enjoyed by our members. We have an active membership outreach program, and everyone is encouraged to help increase our numbers.

Throughout the past two years, LLI adjusted to using Zoom for many classes and gatherings, including monthly Forums. This approach provided an avenue for us to continue to meet, as well as reducing some costs (e.g., rental of the Ernst Center). We will continue to use multiple venues for our classes and activities,

including using Zoom for some. Our budget supports six in-person Forums and three conducted by Zoom in the winter to allow for inclement weather and to accommodate speakers from outside our area.

In summary, LLI has applied conservative and prudent management of resources, and in so doing, has been able to emerge from the past two years without having to increase dues. To sustain that position, retaining current members and recruiting new ones is of paramount importance.

Donations for the June 7 Forum will go to a church in south Arlington whose food pantry has been featured in <a href="The Washington Post">The Washington Post</a> and on <a href="WJLA">WJLA</a>.

Our Lady Queen of Peace Catholic Church, a multi-ethnic parish, has been called by one reporter "what hope looks like in a crisis."

The food pantry is giving out large amounts of food each week, to increasing numbers of persons in need. The pantry needs: instant yellow corn tortilla flour (NOT cornmeal), canola and corn oil, low-sugar cereal, canned fruit, canned vegetables, canned tuna, pasta sauce, white rice, dried beans, and mac and cheese.

The pantry can also put your clean, nondamaged plastic bags to use as they give out fresh items. (We are not collecting fresh items, just the bags.)

Thank you in advance for helping with this last LLI collection before summer. Please bring donations to our in-person Forum on June 7. Bring your donations to the door of Little River United Church of Christ when you come to the Forum. Our collection carts will be right in front of the church.

Foodies & Friends will be sampling the cuisine of Turkey this month. Please join us at **Kazan Restaurant**, a family-owned Turkish eatery which, since

opening its doors in 1980, has become a Washington institution serving delicious and unique dishes from the region. The colorful blues, greens, and golds that fill the Kazan dining room are welcoming. Kazan's menu balances spicy with savory, ensuring that there is something available for all tastes and preferences.

One of Kazan's signature dishes is its interpretation of Doner Kebab, offered only on certain days of the week. (Yes, we will be visiting on one of those days). While lamb dominates the entrée menu, with the most popular being a spicy lamb chop served with rice pilaf and yogurt sauce, there are options for vegetarians, too.

The Washington Post noted, "When you order the house special orange baklava at Kazan's, you'll enjoy a bit of royal dessert history. It's the same creation that Queen Elizabeth II proclaimed as her favorite during a 1971 state visit to Turkey. Restaurant owner Zeynel Abidin Uzun can attest to this, because he made it for her as a young chef at the famous Topkapi Palace Restaurant in Istanbul."
