



The Automobile is Art






Four Sculpture Techniques Carving – cutting or chipping away; stone, wood, hard metals


Casting – melted material is poured into a mold


Modeled – soft of malleable material (clay) built up over an armature

Assembling – gather and join different materials












Elements of Art

- Line a long, narrow point or band; straight or curved
- Color quality of an object with respect to light reflected, usually determined by measurement of hue, saturation and brightness
- Shape the result of closed lines, 2 dimensional or flat, geometric (triangles, squares) organic (curved, abstract)
- Texture the feel, appearance, surface characteristics




